NEW SPEED LIMIT!

The Speed Limit on Main Street has changed!

Please be aware the limit is **now 30 km/h** from the four way stop at the Bistro to the end of Main Street at the Medical Centre.

This change was initiated with the interest of safety after receiving several complaints. Village Council met with Red Deer County Patrol for their input and expertise for the best course of action to take.

With the increase of traffic on Main Street the new speed limit will allow vehicles to back out onto main street safely as well as pull out onto main street easier.

Some 30 km/h signs have been moved and New Speed limit signs have been ordered to be erected as soon as possible. PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

The purpose of the program is to provide delivery of frozen meals to residents of Red Deer County and the Village of Delburne.

HOW DOES THE PROGRAM WORK?

Interested individuals fill out and submit application forms. This can be done online at rdcounty.ca or by phoning Carol, FCSS, 403-749-3654.

Orders are placed every Monday afternoon and delivered to your door on Thursdays.

Payment is required at delivery.

Meals:

Each meal includes a nutritious entrée, starch and vegetable in a microwave safe container.

Meals are low-fat, low-salt and preservative free.

All meals are prepared fresh with quality ingredients.

Meals are specially packaged then frozen to lock in freshness.

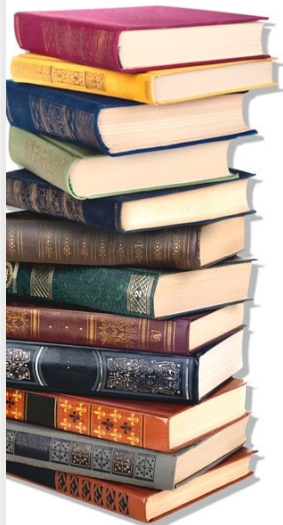

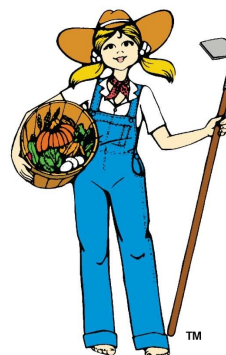
