Unfortunately due to Covid-19 and Alberta Health Services restrictions in place for social distancing, our spring and summer events, public facilities, and parks are closed until further notice.

This means we cannot open the Spray Park, or allow use of the playground equipment including the basket ball court, baseball diamonds, and Skate park.

We cannot allow events or gatherings of more than 15 attendees. This includes the July 1st celebrations, Show & Shine, Garage sales, our Annual Golf Tournament, and worship gatherings.

The Community Hall will be closed until the end of August which means no family events including weddings and funerals.

However, while maintaining our social distancing (1 cow length distance from each other, and small groups less than 15 persons) we can still use the walking paths, go for a bike ride, picnic in our yards, and enjoy the sunshine outdoors. 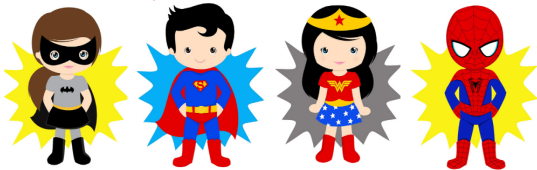
