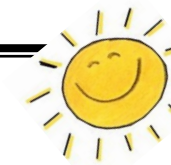
RENOVATIONS AT THE VILLAGE OFFICE!

School Zone Driving Safety Tips:

- ALWAYS obey school signs including the speed limits.
- Stop for school busses that are loading or unloading children.
- Watch out for school crossing guards and obey their signals.
- Be aware of, and watch out for, children near schools, bus stops, side-



walks, in the streets, in school parking lots, etc.

- Never pass other vehicles And Never change lanes while driving in a school zone.

Riding Your Bike to School:

- Always wear a bicycle helmet! In the event of an accident, helmets reduce the risk of head injury by as much as 85 percent.
- Always stay on the right-hand side of the road and ride in the same direction as traffic.
- Choose the safest route between home and school and practice it with children. Ride with a friend, there is safety in numbers.

Walking to School:

- Leave early enough to arrive at school at least 10 minutes prior to the start of school.
- Use the same route every day & never use shortcuts. Go straight home after school. Do not go anywhere else without permission.
- Always use public sidewalks and streets when walking to school.
- Choose the safest route between home and school and practice it with children. Walk with a friend, there is safety in numbers.
- Teach your children to recognize and obey traffic signals, signs, and pavement markings.
- Always look both ways before crossing the street and never enter streets from between obstacles like parked cars, shrubbery, signs, etc. Always walk and never run across intersections. Only cross streets at crosswalks, street corners and intersections.
- Avoid talking to strangers. Teach your children to get distance between themselves and anyone who tries to approach or make contact with them. If a stranger does approach your child, make sure they know to immediately report the incident to you or a teacher. Teach your children to never get into a vehicle with anyone, even if they know them, without your permission.

School Bus Safety:

- Arrive at the bus stop at least five minutes before the scheduled arrival of the bus and stay out of the street and avoid horseplay.
- Be sure the bus comes to a complete stop before getting on or off.
- When riding the bus remain seated and keep their head and arms inside the bus at all times. Do not shout or distract the driver.
- Do not walk in the driver's "blind spot" — this is the area from the front of the bus to about 10 feet in front of the bus.

- Funds must be spent and accounted for as approved by the Board. Accounting of Grant Funds form must be completed and submitted with copies of receipts to the Village office once the funds have been spent.
- Applications that show efforts by other means will be looked at more favorably.
