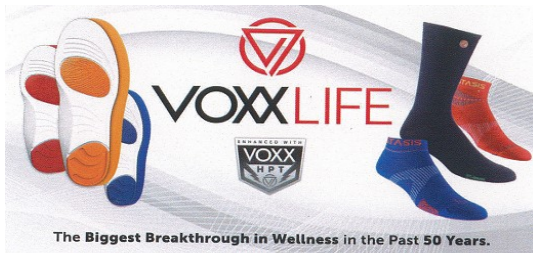

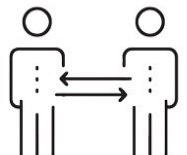

### 2020 JOINT WASTE ROUNDUP PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES

During the Covid Pandemic there will be special precautions taken for the Joint Waste Roundup. There will be traffic control while entering and exiting the site as well as social distancing with cones/barricades indicating a 2 meter distance while loading and unloading. Tables will be placed 6 feet apart with one customer per table at a time. Customers will place items on the table for review to ensure compliance. Face masks will be worn by staff at all times.





## From Dr. Kauchali and the Delburne Medical Centre

The health and safety of our patients, staff, physicians and our community during this difficult time is paramount. Protocols and restrictions have been put in place to help limit the spread of the COVID-19 virus.

The number of positive cases within the Central Zone is rising. It is very important to do everything we can to stop the spread. The virus has a 1-14 day incubation period in which a person may not show symptoms but can pass the virus onto vulnerable people. It is extremely important that we take any and all precautions that we can.

These include:

1. Keeping the 6 foot social distance
2. Wearing masks in public; 3-layered fabric masks worn correctly, are just as effective.
3. Washing/sanitizing hands frequently

COVID symptoms include fever, sore throat, cough, shortness of breath, rash and diarrhea. If you have come in contact with a positive person isolate yourself at home and call 811 to organize a test. Do not present to your family clinic or the hospital with any of these symptoms without talking to someone at 811 first. It is possible to have the virus and experience no symptoms and pass it on to others. Not everyone who gets the virus will end up in hospital, but there is no way to know who will and who will not require medical support within a hospital setting.

The only way to protect ourselves and our loved ones is to be safe, to wear masks, wash our hands and if you are unwell stay home and away from other people.

It is each and every one of our responsibility to prevent the spread to our loved ones and the community at large.
