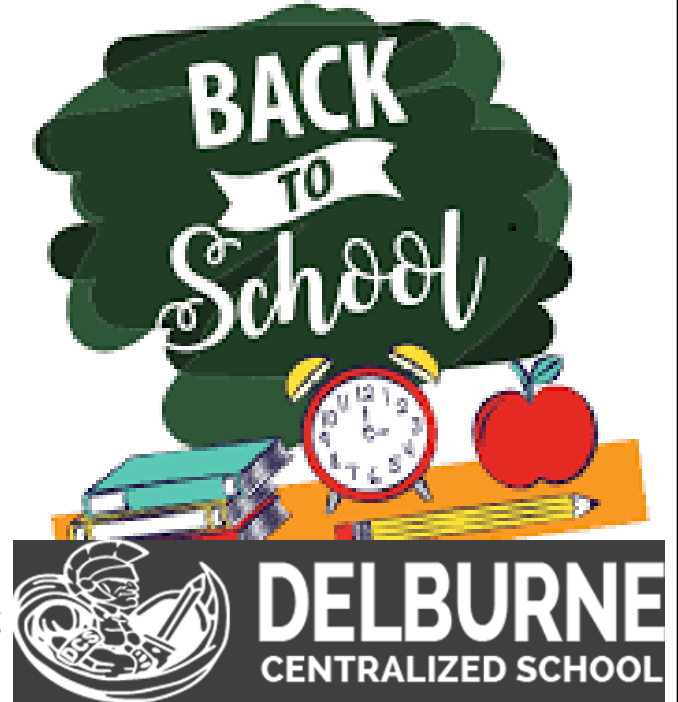
Delburne's Community Newsletter

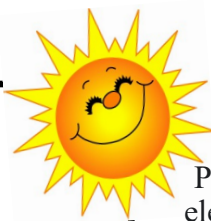

Delburne Family and Community Support Services is a non-profit organization dedicated to the strengthening and enhancing of family and community life by offering locally based preventative and supportive services, promoting volunteerism and coordinating partnerships within the community.



Alberta Seniors Benefit (ASB)

Income thresholds have increased to \$28,785 for a single senior and \$46,745 for a senior couple. Reminder that July 1, 2020 was the start of the 2020-21 benefit year and we are now using the 2019 income.

Special Needs Assistance for Seniors (SNA)

Income thresholds have increased as follows:

	Primary/Secondary	Primary Only	No Funding
Single Senior	\$0 - \$24,385	\$24,386 - \$28,785	Over \$28,785
Senior Couple	\$0 - \$38,545	\$38,546 - \$46,745	Over \$46,745

New for July 1, 2020 laundry costs and personal response installations are no longer eligible expenses. As well, the maximum monthly coverage for personal response services has been reduced to \$20 per month.

Reminder as of March 1, 2020 SNA no longer assisted with funeral expenses, lift chairs and foot orthotics.

Dental and Optical Assistance For Seniors

Income thresholds for the maximum dental and optical coverage have increased as follows:

WALK THROUGH TIME CHALLENGE

Delburne FCSS in collaboration with the Museum challenged residents to take a walk through time during August.

Clues were provided weekly for 12 historical destinations. Participants were challenged to determine each location and submit selfies at the destination.

These are examples of a few of the clues:

In 1917 this two storey flat roofed building was constructed on this site. In 1960 a new steel reinforced concrete vault was installed. The first business operated out of this building until 2000.

People would come here when dough was needed. Now they come here for dough that is kneaded. Where am I?

“They called them prairie giants standing tall beside the tracks, their bins were full of barley, durum wheat or maybe flax.” poem by BJ Smith. These structures dominated prairie landscape for more than a century with every community having one. Our first was built in 1914 followed by the second one being built in 1927. What am I?

This destination was built by a one legged cobbler in 1930. Robert Dunsmuir only had one leg and his loyal dog Patty would take him to work by toboggan in the winter and a two wheeled cart in the summer. This building went from fixing worn out soles to getting nice clean clothes. Where am I?

ANSWERS:

- 1) Bank of Montreal/ Old Bank Bakery located on Main Street.
- 2) Elevators – Marker is on walking path by the railroad tracks
- 3) Dunsmuir Shoe Repair/ Laundromat located

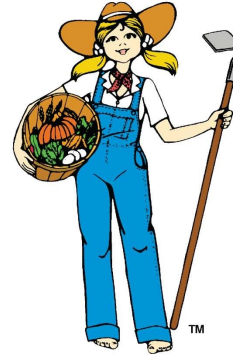

COVID-19 INFORMATION

HOW TO WEAR A NON-MEDICAL MASK

Non-medical masks, including homemade cloth masks, can help prevent the spread COVID-19. They are another tool to use in places where it's difficult to keep two metres from other people for extended periods of time – such as public transit, grocery stores, pharmacies, hair salons, airplanes and some retail shops.

Masks do not replace proper hygiene, physical distancing or isolation to prevent the spread.

SAFELY PUTTING A MASK ON

- 1 Wash/sanitize your hands.
- 2 Inspect the mask, holding it by the ties or loops. Discard if damaged or dirty.
- 3 Open fully to cover from the bridge of your nose to your chin.
- 4 Adjust the mask to your face so there are no gaps on the side.
- 5 If mask has stiff edge, pinch to close gaps between nose and mask.
- 6 Keep your nose, mouth and chin covered at all times. **Avoid touching the mask.**

SAFELY TAKING OFF A MASK

- 1 Wash/sanitize your hands.
- 2 Remove it from the back by releasing ties or loops. Do not touch the front of the mask.
- 3 Discard the mask immediately if disposable. Wash thoroughly if reusable.
- 4 Wash/sanitize your hands.
