Delburne Ratepayers Receive a 6% Tax Rebate

The Village of Delburne has received \$95,323.00 from the Alberta Government's Municipal Operating Support Transfer (MOST). This funding program was designed to assist municipalities who are experiencing significant financial impacts due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Council decided that it was pertinent to use some of the MOST funding to deliver a bit of financial relief to ratepayers by providing a 6% tax rebate. \$44,533.00 has been returned to residents and businesses through the rebate which was calculated based on the 2020 general municipal tax levy. Credits have already been applied to property tax accounts.

Please do not deposit animal feces, dirt, or garbage bags in the trailer!

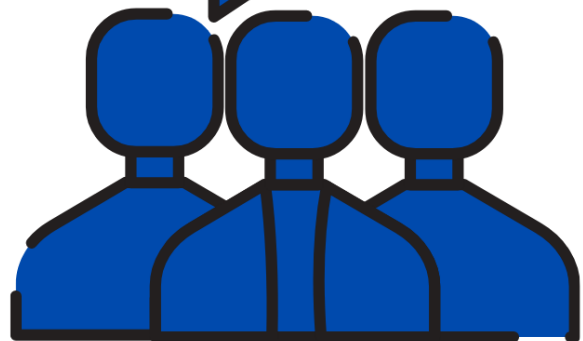

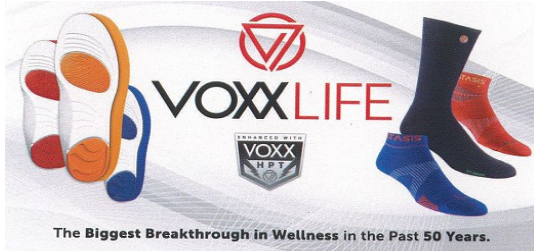

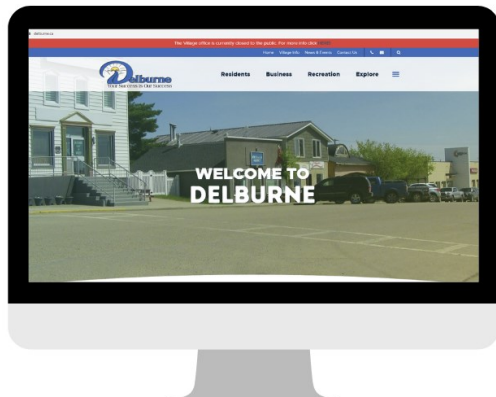

Three Hills & Area Restorative Justice

Coordinator Position

The Three Hills & Area Restorative Justice Society is seeking a Program Coordinator to work approximately 20 to 30 hours per week. Restorative Justice is an approach to justice in which one of the responses to a crime is to organize a meeting between the victim and the offender, sometimes with representatives of the wider community.

The following is some of what the Program Coordinator will do:

Casework

- Receive and manage referrals from community partners
- Assess appropriateness of referrals, and set up facilitator conferences
- Oversee completion of files
- Provide updates to referral sources throughout
- Complete final paperwork upon file completion

Volunteer Management

- Oversee recruitment
- Coordinate advanced trainings and volunteer appreciation events
- Address the needs of volunteers serving the organization

Program Administration

- Liaising with referring agencies (RCMP, Victim Assistance Unit, Elementary and High Schools etc.)
- Conduct general office administration duties
- Manage email accounts for Three Hills and Area Restorative Justice Society
- Conduct event planning, such as the AGM, public education, fundraisers, etc.
- Coordinate grant seeking, writing, and reporting
- Regular communications to the board and the public as necessary
- Additional hours may be added, depending on grants and other funding sources.

Closing of the Main Street Park Campground

In the April 2021 edition of the Village Voice, Council announced that they would be closing the Main Street Park Campground. There were many reasons why the decision was made to close the campground. They are as follows:

- Council believes that the Village of Delburne should not compete with businesses who offer camping in our community.
- The campground is not utilized that much.
- The municipality loses money every year as the cost to maintain the area and services far outweighs the funds gained from camping fees.
- Plans are in place to change the entrance at Main Street Park. The park is going to be revamped with a new structure.
- Several complaints have been made about suspicious people camping and watching the complainant's children.

After this announcement, there was misinformation being spread regarding camping in Delburne about two campgrounds being closed. The only campground closure is the Main Street Park Campground.

People are welcome to still camp near the ball diamonds and rodeo grounds during events. Money has never been collected when people have camped over there.

Delburne Council has received letters from residents who are disappointed in the decision to close the Main Street Park Campground, therefore Council would like to hear public opinion on this matter.

MAY IS MOTORCYCLE SAFETY MONTH IN ALBERTA

Alberta RCMP encourages you to practice the following **motorcycle safety tips**:

- **Gear up.** Along with a helmet, riders should wear shatter-proof eye protection & durable weather clothes to remain comfortable while riding.
- **Stay bright and in sight.** Staying out of blind spots on roadways and in parking lots will help keep other drivers aware of your presence.
- **Showing off does not pay off but driving defensively does.** Remember, motorcycles are smaller than most vehicles. Be aware of your surroundings, share the road and change lanes with extreme caution.
- **Practice makes perfect.** Riders should practice on safe roads away from high-traffic areas and highways to make sure they are comfortable and confident in their skills on the road.
