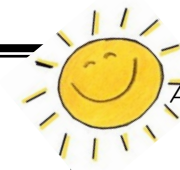

Delburne Gospel Church

King Xerxes I of Babylon, reigned from 486–465 BC. His wife, Queen Vashti, was exceptionally beautiful. Her beauty made him proud and he liked to show her off at feasts and royal celebrations. One night Queen Vashti refused to be put on display for all the nobles and commoners. King Xerxes was furious and banished her from the throne and his household. In time he wishes for another Queen. He held a beauty pageant across all of Babylon for all the single young women. One woman truly stood out from the others. She was not only beautiful but also graceful, kind, fair and won the hearts of those she encountered. Her name was Esther. King Xerxes fell in love with her and proclaimed her Queen.

Queen Esther was an orphan who had been raised by her cousin Mordecai, a Jew living in the Susa region of Babylon. Mordecai uncovered a plot to assassinate King Xerxes. Mordecai gave Queen Esther the news who in turn gave it to the King. The traitors were caught, and the events were written in the King's records.

An official named Haman was honored by the King and elevated above the other nobles and officials. By royal command everyone was to bow to Haman as he passed. As Jews only bow to God, Mordecai would not bow. This angered Haman. Haman told the King that there were some people within the kingdom who are not obeying the King's laws and that if it pleased the King, he will destroy them. The King trusted Haman and did not ask for details, he gave permission for Haman to do as he wanted. Dispatches were sent by couriers to all the king's provinces with the order to destroy, kill and annihilate all the Jews— young and old, women and children—on a single day.
