If you need a recycling box, contact the Village Office. A \$10 charge may apply.

## REMINDERS:

- **Taxes can be paid monthly** by automatic withdrawal or cheque. Please sign up at the Village Office before January 15, 2019!
- **Receive a 4% discount** on your taxes by paying in full before January 31, 2019. (The amount will be 2018's tax levy as 2019 tax levy's are not calculated until May.)
- **Business Licenses** are due no later than January 31, 2019. \$10 late fee will be charged after January.
- **Dog Licenses** are also due no later than January 31, 2019. \$15 altered and \$35 unaltered. Proof of spay/neuter is required. \$50 late fee will be charged after January.
- **Dog Fines:**
  - Unlicensed dog = \$100
  - Licensed dog at large = \$500
  - Un-licensed dog at large = \$600
- **Snow Removal:** Property owners are to keep their sidewalks clear of ice and snow within 24 hours of a snowfall.


## A Message From The Village

Are you interested in becoming a Volunteer and complete tax returns for our low income residents? Computer is required. Training is provided.

Volunteers do not prepare returns for individuals who:
