

What is the FCSS Snow Angels Program?

The Snow Angels Program aims to encourage neighbours to help one another and thereby build a caring, engaged community. Residents in need of snow removal have "Snow Angels" signs placed on their yards or in their windows.

Who is eligible to have a Snow Angels sign?

Residents who need assistance removing snow are eligible. This may be older adults, a person with mobility issues, or a person who is convalescing. The Snow Angels Program relies on the good will of neighbourhood volunteers. Placement of a Snow Angel sign is not a guarantee that snow will be removed.

Who are Snow Angels?

Snow Angels are individuals: youth, seniors, families and community groups who voluntarily shovel snow for residents needing snow removal assistance.

Where can I get a sign?

Residents wanting a Snow Angels sign can stop by FCSS at the Village Office or call Carol 749-3654.





Making Your Bill Payments

The Village of Delburne offers many ways to make it easy to pay your utility and property tax bills.

Your Payment Options Include:

- In person at the Village Office during office hours. We take debit, cash or cheque.
- Village Office Drop Box - We have a mail box in our front door for you to conveniently drop an envelope with cash or a cheque along with your invoice.
- Cheque by mail - Send the top portion of your invoice along with a cheque.
- Online Banking - If you bank with Scotiabank, Servus Credit Union or ATB Financial, you can pay your bill online.

Cheque Tip: Don't forget to write your account number and what the payment is for (Property Taxes or Utilities) on your cheque

Why Can't I Pay Online With My Bank?

Unfortunately if you do not bank with Scotiabank, Servus Credit Union or ATB Financial, you cannot pay through online banking. Through your feedback, we recently conducted research with the other banks to find out information about setting up online bill payments in order to expand our options for our residents and businesses. Regrettably the high cost of set up and user fees were too significant to put on our taxpayers.

Online Bill Payment Tips

We want to make sure that your electronic funds transfer goes onto the correct account. Your Property Taxes and Utilities have different account numbers. Double check that you have the right account number to avoid payment posting errors. If you are using your utility account number when paying online for an invoice, such as Lifeline services, please contact us so that we can make sure your payment goes to the correct bill. If not, it might accidentally go towards your utilities.

Property Tax Account

If you are making a payment to your property taxes, use your roll number which is the 5 consecutive numbers (after the 3 zeros) as seen highlighted in the picture.

Dispelling the Myths

At the Village Office we frequently hear about misinformation being spread around Delburne. It's important to us that the community be properly informed and that they come to us with questions and concerns. Here are some examples of incorrect information we have heard about:

**Are you receiving
the
CORRECT
information?**

MYTH: The Village spent \$200,000 on flush toilets for the golf course.

FACT: The Village did not spend any money on toilets for the golf course. The Delburne & District Golf and Recreation Society leases the land from the Village for Fawn Meadows Golf & Country Club. The Society manages and operates all aspects of the golf course, including finances.

MYTH: There isn't a Food Bank in Delburne.

FACT: Delburne does have a food bank. The Village donates space in the basement of the Village office for the Delburne Food Bank however the Village does not have authority over its operation. The Delburne Food Bank Committee is a group of volunteers who manage the program. If you are in need of the Food Bank's services or you would like to donate, please call and leave a message at (403) 598-3588.

MYTH: The Village increased water rates because the water main broke.

FACT: The water main break was paid for with the restrictive surplus that is reserved for unexpected situations. The water rates were increased by \$2.00 to pay for the operation of water services. The consumption charges you pay for on your utility bills are put away for major water projects.

MYTH: I don't need a Development Permit for my new shed.

FACT: A Development Permit is required if the building is over 102.3 sq ft in floor area or 8.2 ft in height. For more information on Development Permits visit: www.delburne.ca/about-delburne/bylaws-documents/building-renovations
