DELBURNE VILLAGE COUNCIL APPROVES TAX RATE AND PENALTY DEFERRAL

May 13, 2020

On April 28th, Delburne Council approved the 2020 Tax Rate Bylaw and at the May 12th Council meeting an amendment to the Tax Penalty Bylaw was passed. The General Municipal Levy for both residential and non-residential properties did not increase this year. In fact the municipal tax rate has not increased since 2016.

The rates are as follows:

Residential: 7.2514

Non-residential: 18.8441

Special levies and requisitions are as follows:

Alberta School Foundation Fund

(Residential): 2.5817

Alberta School Foundation Fund (Non-

residential): 3.5915

Seniors Housing Levy: 0.01857

Designated Industrial Assessment: 0.07612

The deadline to pay property taxes is June 30th. However, No penalty charges will be applied on unpaid taxes on July 1st.

Due to the economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, an amendment was made to the Tax Penalty Bylaw No. 1136/2018 to defer penalties until October 1, 2020. All terms of Bylaw No. 1136/2018 will come back into effect on January 1, 2021.

Currently our trees on Main Street needed to be cut down due to Black Knot, but what is Black Knot?



Black Knot is a very common disease of plants in the genus Prunus variety and may result in the eventual death of affected trees.

DISEASED WOOD MUST BE DESTROYED

IMMEDIATELY (burned, buried or removed from site). Diseased knots can produce and release spores for up to 4 months after removal.

If you are considering planting new trees speak with your garden center professional about Black Knot.

Affected trees: Amur Cherry, Mayday Tree, Apricot, Mongolian Cherry, Black Cherry, Nanking Cherry, Chokecherry, Pin Cherry, Dropmore Cherry, Cultivated Plum, Flowering Almond, Wild Plum, Flowering Plum, Prunus Hybrids, Japanese Plum, Sand Cherry, Korean Cherry, and Sour Cherry.

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Meal Delivery Program

PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

The purpose of the program is to provide delivery of frozen meals to residents of Red Deer County, the Town of Bowden, the Town of Penhold, the Village of Delburne and the Village of Elnora who are self-isolating during the Covid-19 pandemic.

HOW DOES THE PROGRAM WORK?

Interested individuals fill out and submit application forms about their delivery. Applications will be reviewed to determine address, phone number, and any special instructions about the delivery. Staff will then call the individual to notify them that the delivery will be arriving.

Upon arrival at the delivery address, staff will ensure that conditions are safe for delivery. They will then proceed to the front step (or designated location) and leave the frozen meals there.

IS THERE A COST TO THE PROGRAM?

Yes. Payment can be made via Eventbrite.ca (preferred), by cheque or by exact cash only (no change to be given). Orders placed through Eventbrite.ca are automatically submitted to the County office. Costs for Individual meal options are \$7.00 and family meals are \$25.00 (please see form for meal options).

WHO IS MAKING THE MEALS?

Meals are being commercially prepared by local groups and both meal programs follow the Canada Food Guide. Orders will be taken once a week. No substitutions.

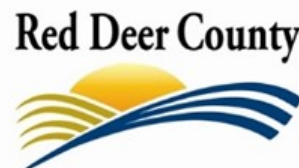

Early Childhood Development:

Serving families with children aged 0-6. Child activities will be directly related to: Fine Motor Skills, Gross Motor Skills, Communication Skills, Problem Solving Skills and Personal-Social Skills.

Child & Youth Development:

Child and Youth Development will serve families with youth aged 7 - 18; through social skills groups, life skills groups, anger management groups, coping skills groups and youth leadership development.

Parent Education:

Parent Education will serve families with children and youth aged 0-18. Programming will include Connect, Kids Have Stress Too, Triple P, Circle of Security and Active Parenting.

In May Public Works cut down trees on Main street. Unfortunately these trees had Black Knot, a fungal disease which spreads easily to other trees. Black Knot Disease is common in fruit bearing trees. Our team has done all that they could to get rid of the black knot and unfortunately the final solution was to remove the trees. These trees were replaced with non-fruit bearing such as Maple and Hawthorn.

NOTICE OF PREPARATION AND MAILING OF 2020 ASSESSMENT AND TAX NOTICES

Notice pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Government Act, Section 311 (1), being Chapter M26, RSA 2000 as amended, is hereby given with respect to the 2020 Assessment and Tax Notices:

Combined Assessment and Tax Notices for the Village of Delburne were mailed May 26, 2020.

Taxes are due and payable without penalty by June 30, 2020.

A penalty of 15% will be added to any outstanding current taxes as of October 1, 2020. A further penalty of 10% will be levied on all taxes which remain outstanding on January 1, 2021.

All assessed persons are deemed to have received their assessment notices as a result of the publication of this Notice.

Any assessed person(s) who has/have not received their 2020 Assessment and Tax Notice(s) should contact the municipal office during regular business hours for a copy.

Assessment complaints must be filed within 60 days from the date of mailing of notice and must be filed using the Government of Alberta "Assessment Review Complaint Form" (number LGS1402) available by contacting the Municipal Office at 403.749.3606 or by going online to http://www.municipalaffairs.alberta.ca/mc_property_assessment_and_taxation.cfm. Parks & Playgrounds Reopen in Delburne

Effective May 27, 2020, the parks and playgrounds in Delburne have reopened.

This reopening includes:

- Main Street Park including the outdoor gym and basketball court
- Skate Park
- Fawn Meadows Playground

At this time the ball diamonds, splash park, and the washrooms at Main Street Park remain closed to adhere to the Province of Alberta's Public Health Order guidelines regarding COVID-19.

Use the playground at your own risk.

To ensure the safety of children, families and communities, individuals should take precautions while visiting playgrounds. Using playgrounds does have some risks. Children may find it difficult to avoid touching their eyes, nose or mouth. This can lead to the spread of the virus to playground equipment, other children and other families.

Playground users must comply with gathering restrictions and maintain physical distancing of 2 metres between individuals not of the same household.

Please practice proper hand hygiene. It is the responsibility of parents and individuals to sanitize before and after use as the playground and outdoor gym equipment will **NOT** be disinfected by the Village.

Do not visit the parks and playgrounds if you are sick or having symptoms related to COVID-19.
