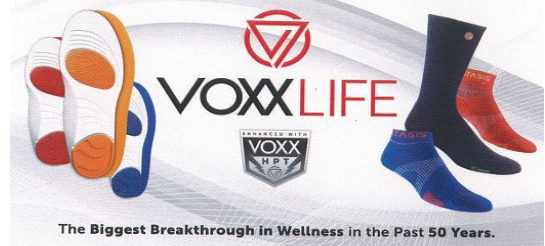

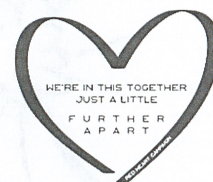

Lemon Cranberry Scones

2/3 cup sour cream	1/2 teaspoon baking soda
4 cups flour	1 cup white sugar
2 teaspoons baking powder	1 teaspoon salt
1 cup butter	1 lemon milk
1 egg	1 cup dried cranberries, sweetened

Instructions

- Heat oven to 350 degrees.
- Mix together baking soda and sour cream.
- Whisk all your dry ingredients together in a large bowl. Add your butter and cut in until it's crumbly.
- Take your lemon and grate the peel off of it into the flour mixture. Cut your lemon in half, and squeeze all the juice out, picking out the seeds. You should get almost a 1/4 cup of lemon juice.
- Add in enough milk to bring it to 1/3 of a cup. Don't worry if the milk curdles.
- Mix the sour cream, milk and egg into the dry ingredients. Once it's mixed a bit, add in the cranberries. Divide into three balls, then flatten into 6 inch disks. Cut each piece into 6 triangles.
- Bake until golden brown, from 15-20 minutes.

November is Fall Prevention Month

What is the FCSS Snow Angels Program?
The Snow Angels Program aims to encourage neighbours to help one another and thereby build a caring, engaged community. Residents in need of snow removal have "Snow Angels" signs placed on their yards or in their windows.

Who is eligible to have a Snow Angels sign?
Residents who need assistance removing snow are eligible. This may be older adults, a person with mobility issues, or a person who is convalescing. The Snow Angels Program relies on the good will of neighbourhood volunteers. Placement of a Snow Angel sign is not a guarantee that snow will be removed.

Who are Snow Angels?
Snow Angels are individuals: youth, seniors, families and community groups who voluntarily shovel snow for residents needing snow removal assistance.

Where can I get a sign?
Residents wanting a Snow Angels sign can stop by FCSS at the Village Office or call Carol 749-3654.
