

Kitchen Upgrades are Happening at the Community Hall

The Delburne Community Hall is receiving upgrades thanks to the Government of Alberta's Community Facility Enhancement Program which offers financial assistance to purchase, build, renovate or upgrade public-use community facilities. The Delburne Community Hall Board Society was awarded the funding to renovate the kitchen in order to upgrade the old, failing appliances. For grant approval, the Hall Board Society had to raise 50% of the project costs which was acquired through funding from Delburne Council and donations from the community. When finished, the facility will have a commercial grade kitchen with proper ventilation which will be compliant with the Alberta Public Health Act and the Province's food regulations.

To accommodate the air intake equipment for the kitchen ventilation, Delburne Council has made a motion to close a section of the alley with lockable gates on the west end of the Delburne Community Hall. Residents who use the alley will be able to access it from the Community Hall parking lot as well as the accessways off of 21st and 22nd Ave. Local groups and programs such as community suppers or *Cooking with Seniors* will benefit from these improvements as it will provide reliable, functional equipment to allow them to prepare and cook large quantities of food. The kitchen enhancements will also make the hall a more attractive rental space for special events. Renovations are expected to be finished by the beginning of September. In the near future, the Delburne Community Hall Board Society will announce a grand opening to celebrate the upgrades.

Fence to be Installed on North Side of the Dry Dump

Council made a motion at the August 17th meeting to approve local company, Three Gen Custom Fencing Inc.'s quote for installing a fence on the north side of the Dry Dump, which borders the golf course's new campground, as well as Tracey Peters' quote to level the area for the fence. Two quotes were obtained for building the fence with funding coming from the Waste Management restricted surplus. The 6 feet high galvanized chain link fence will enclose the Dry Dump to keep out trespassers.

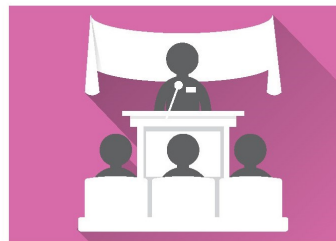

6% Tax Rebate

Delburne received \$95,323.00 from the Alberta Government's Municipal Operating Support Transfer (MOST) program which was designed to assist municipalities who experienced significant financial impacts due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Council decided to use some of the MOST funding to provide a 6% tax rebate to property owners. \$44,533.00 has been returned to property owners through the rebate.

Fiber Optics Network

High speed internet has arrived in Delburne, thanks to a partnership with Red Deer County. Valo Networks and Tether Communications were hired to construct and provide customer service for the fiber optics network.



Medical Centre

Residents no longer have to travel outside of our community to receive medical care as the Delburne Medical Centre opened in 2019. This fully equipped, modern medical facility is an integrated health centre that provides an on-site pharmacy and other health services such as dental hygiene and pain management therapy.



Upgrades to the Municipal Office

Renovations to the Village office have made it more accessible with a new ramp and entranceway, including an automatic door button. Interior upgrades have extended the customer service counter to assist more than one patron at a time.

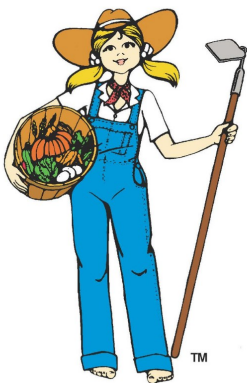

Three Hills Victim Services Appreciation Event

When tragedy strikes, lives are shattered, uncertainty overflows, and victims feel lost and alone. At times like these, those who have been impacted, our neighbours, our friends and our families need a place to turn for emotional support, comfort, information and referrals. That's where the Three Hills Victim Services trained and dedicated Victim Advocates step in. This group of committed community volunteers are on-call 24 hours a day, and work under the guidance and direction of the Three Hills RCMP. The support they provide comes with over 100 hours of intensive training, which equips them to respond with care, compassion, and competence to suicides, family violence, sexual assault, traffic fatalities, and sudden death. In the past two months, Three Hills Victim Services has assisted 138 people at their time of deepest need.

All of their time is volunteer time and he acknowledged that their time takes them away from their family to serve the RCMP to help victims in need.

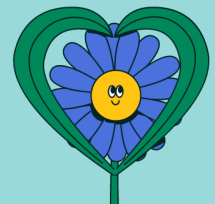
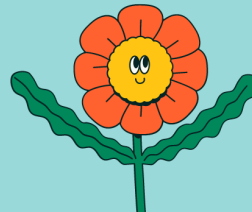
