

Delburne Council is Acclaimed

On Nomination Day, September 20, 2021, the Village of Delburne received nomination papers from 5 residents. With 5 seats available, Delburne Council was declared elected by acclamation.

Your Delburne Council is Jeff Bourne, Bill Chandler, Kathy Faulk, Ray Reckseidler, and Tim Wilson. At the September 28th Organizational Meeting, Bill Chandler was voted in as Mayor of Delburne with the rest of Council taking quarterly turns as Deputy Mayor. Delburne Council and staff would like to take this opportunity to thank retired Councillors Darlene Dushanek and Daphne Warner for their service on Delburne Council. We appreciate the time and commitment that they have made to our community. Thank you!

Delburne residents will still go to the polls on Election Day, October 18th to vote for the Senate election and referendum. There are currently 13 nominations for the Senate election which are listed after the Council profiles and there will be two referendum questions:

1. **Should section 36(2) of the Constitution Act, 1982 – Parliament and the government of Canada’s commitment to the principle of making equalization payments – be removed from the constitution?**
2. **Do you want Alberta to adopt year-round Daylight Saving Time, which is summer hours, eliminating the need to change our clocks twice a year?**

The polling station will be from 10 am - 8 pm on Monday, October 18th at the Delburne Community Hall. For more information about the Senate election and referendum questions, please visit www.elections.ab.ca.

Village Speed Limit to Change to 40 km/hr

Council voted unanimously in favour of changing the speed limit throughout Delburne to 40 km/hr unless otherwise posted. Some residents had raised concerns about unsafe drivers and speeding throughout the village. Council decided that further feedback was required before making the decision therefore over 400 surveys were distributed to property owners with 52 responses being returned; 39 surveys were in favour of the speed limit change while 13 were not.

Main Street (20th St.) will increase from 30 km/hr to 40 km/hr except for in playground zones. The speed limit change isn't immediate as the village needs to prepare by ordering signs and consulting with Red Deer County Patrol over implementation and enforcement. Once the change is completed, an educational period will take place to ease drivers into the adjusted speed limit. Stay tuned for more information.

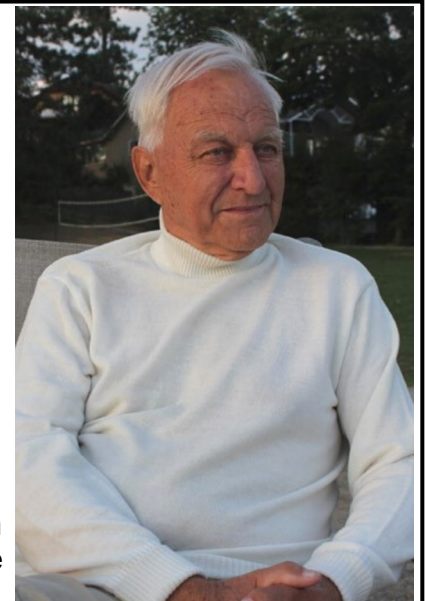
