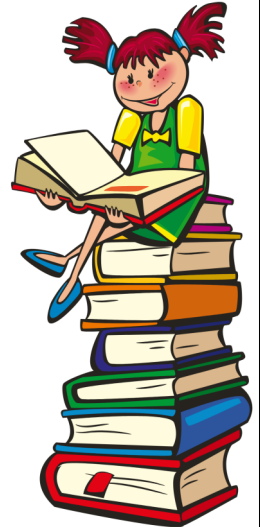

# Home Safety Checklist

**Use this list to help make your home safer and reduce your risk of a fall**

#### Floors

Remove area rugs and floor mats  
Tape cords or wires next to the wall so you can't trip over them.

#### Bedrooms

Put a nightlight in bedrooms, bathroom, and hallway

#### Kitchen

Move items in the cupboards that you use most often to the height of your waist.

#### Bathrooms

Put a non-slip rubber mat or strips on the tub or shower floor  
Have a grab bar put in next to the toilet and on the inside wall of the tub.  
remove small rugs and use a non-slip mat beside the tub.

#### Stairs and Steps

Make sure there are sturdy handrails.  
Keep steps clear and free of objects.  
Make sure stairs and steps are well lit.
