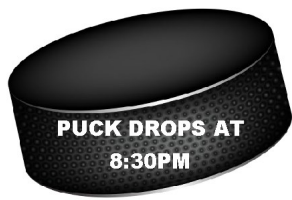

Park your car close to the exit and in a well lit area

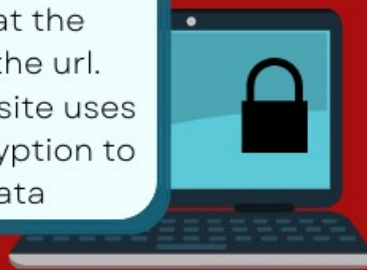


Don't withdraw more money than you require

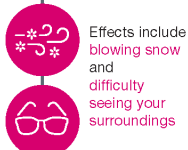

Severe winter weather can be dangerous without a plan.

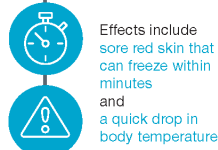
Blizzards

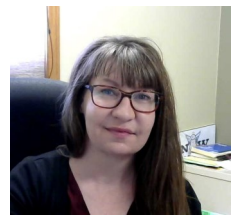

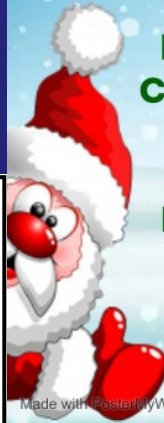
