Delburne Headed to a By-Election

Delburne residents will be heading to the polls on Monday, March 14th as Councillor Bill Chandler submitted his resignation from Delburne Council to Chief Administrative Officer Karen Fegan on Tuesday, January 18th. Previously holding the position of mayor, Bill Chandler stepped down as Mayor of Delburne at the Tuesday, January 11th Council meeting due to increased personal commitments but upon reflection he has decided that it would be best to leave the council table altogether.

Chandler says, "Recently my life has moved in a different direction where I am no longer permanently residing in Delburne. I believe the appropriate action would be to resign my position on Council so that the community be best served by a full time resident. I am proud to have served six years on Council where I have been involved in bringing a medical centre and a fiber optic network to our village. I look forward to the next chapter in my life and wish the new Council all of the best during their term."

At the Tuesday, January 11th Council Meeting, Councillor Tim Wilson accepted the nomination of Mayor. He will hold the position until the annual

Organizational Meeting in October 2022.

During the Tuesday, January 25th Council Meeting, a By-Election date was set for Tuesday, March 14th. Voting will take place at the Delburne Community Hall from 10:00 am to 8:00 pm. An Advanced Vote will take place on Thursday, March 10th from 3:00 pm to 8:00 pm at the Delburne Municipal Office.

Nominations for the Councillor vacancy are now open and will close on Monday, February 14th at Noon. Nomination packages can be picked up at the Delburne Municipal Office during regular business hours or downloaded online at www.delburne.ca/about-delburne/council/2022-By-Election.

Account Updates and Disclosure of Information

The Delburne Municipal office has received many requests lately to access and change account information by people who are not the account holder. Please note that under the Province of Alberta's Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, we will not disclose or change personal information on accounts unless the person requesting has their name on the land title.

If you are a property owner and you would like to grant someone such as a family member or renter, to access your account information, we require written authorization, along with a signature, to keep on file.

Desludging of Delburne Lagoons

The Village of Delburne will be paying an estimated cost of \$117,700.00 to desludge 4 out of the 7 lagoon cells due to debris clogging the sewer system. Currently cell 1 is completely plugged off. The estimated cost to desludge cells 5 and 6 is close to \$300,000.00.

Items such as Swiffers, disinfectant wipes, feminine hygiene products, grease, and more should not be flushed down the toilet. Just because the product says it is "flushable" does not mean it is biodegradable.

The desludging work will be done sometime later in 2022 when the ground thaws.



Alberta RCMP Launch Mobile App

Alberta RCMP has officially launched their brand-new mobile app for iOS and Android devices. The app has been developed to simplify online user experience on mobile devices to ensure that Albertans can access information quickly and conveniently.

Developing the app allows the Alberta RCMP to provide the public with online access to news, crime reporting, detachment locations, crime mapping and statistics, and a map for initiatives like Project Lock Up. The app also

provides access to partner law enforcement services, mental health supports, Crime Stoppers and links to Alberta RCMP social media accounts.

Even though the app provides convenient links to Alberta RCMP social media accounts, this app will not replace existing website, social media feeds, or other sources for information. The tool also will not replace other methods of crime reporting, engagement, or emergency assistance. Citizens should remember that social media posts or use of other third-party crime apps are not appropriate ways to report a crime.

In full compliance with Canadian privacy laws for mobile apps by the Office of the Privacy Commissioner of Canada and the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner of Alberta, the Alberta RCMP app will not track or monitor users in any way.

For emergencies, or if you see a crime in progress, phone 911. For non-emergency property crimes, you can file your report online through the Alberta RCMP app, or contact your nearest RCMP detachment.
