Community Hall Rates Update

At the March 22, 2022 meeting, Council made a motion to adjust the hall rental rates. It has been many years since the rates have increased and with the rising cost of utilities, Council decided it was time for an update.

Here are the new fees:

Daily Rental: Includes use of commercial kitchen	\$300.00 + GST
Meeting Rental: 2 hours maximum. Rental is depending on availability.	\$50.00 + GST
3 Day Event Package: the Hall, commercial kitchen and the bar (bar use is for one day as determined by the renter's liquor license).	\$900.00 + GST
Bar Rental: This fee is on top of the Hall rental for the day.	\$150.00 + GST
BBQ: Rented out alongside a Hall rental. Renter supplies the propane and must clean when finished.	\$50.00 + GST
Portable Stage: with \$500.00 damage deposit	\$100.00 + GST

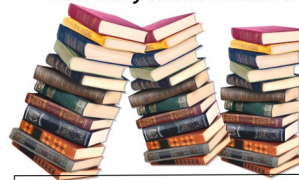

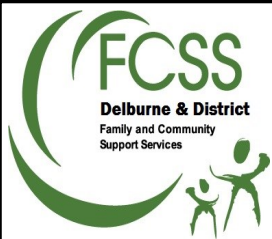

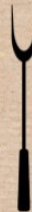
