The Village of Delburne Council is excited to announce that they will be moving forward to create the new Community Strategic Plan for Delburne. It will set the strategy and vision of the municipality for the next three years and build on the progress that has been made within the community.

In developing this new plan, the Village has three main objectives; 1) Updating the mission, mandate, values, and vision for the municipality; 2) Create strategic priorities that will guide the Council's decisions, and 3) Target areas of growth and development based on the Village's strengths.

"Creating and committing to strategic plans provides the foundation for our pursuit of economic development efforts. These can aid our community and our citizens in achieving our vision for the future. Citizen engagement is key to these plans. Our citizens will be able to share their opinions, insights, and goals for the future of our village. We value what our residents have to say, and we want to make sure that we are acting in their interest", says Karen Fegan, CAO for the Village of Delburne.

We are making significant effort to hear from our residents and businesses. We will be conducting a series of engagements with businesses, stakeholders, and the community at large over the coming weeks.

Reminder for Back-to-School Safety

School is back in session this September and the Alberta RCMP would like to share some tips to ensure that everyone stays safe this school year.



- Pay attention to posted 30 km/hr. speed limits.
- When a school bus is flashing its alternate red lights, stop and do not pass as children may be on or off-loading.
- Look out for children, especially during school operating hours. Kids can easily become distracted and unaware of their surroundings.
- Share the road with cyclists. Be patient when following and provide extra space when passing.



- When pedestrians are crossing the street, come to a complete stop and do not block the crosswalk with your vehicle. Ensure that pedestrians have cleared the road before proceeding.

Council seeks CAEP Business Representative

The Village of Delburne Council is looking for a business owner, whose business is located within Village limits and holds a current business license, to be a Delburne representative for the Central Alberta Economic Partnership (CAEP). CAEP supports local municipalities to help advance regional economic development.

Fats, oils and grease can create blockages in your house's sewer lines and the Village's main lines.

- 1 Pour grease into an aluminum can or heat-safe container, not down the drain. When cool, dispose of grease in the garbage.
- 2 Scrape any food remains into the garbage before rinsing the dishes.
- 3 Catch any scraps of food in a sink strainer.





