

Three Hills RCMP Participate in Province-wide “Operation Cold Start”

Three Hills, Alta - With the cold winter temperatures, Three Hills RCMP are reminding everyone to ensure their vehicle is never unattended or unlocked with keys nearby or in the ignition. Approximately 25% of stolen vehicles in Alberta are stolen while idling and these thefts are far more prevalent in the cold winter months. Vehicles can be stolen in seconds by thieves lying in wait. Often times, thieves will look for people who start their vehicles and then leave them unattended as they return in their houses or into a store.

To help keep your property safe, Three Hills RCMP are taking action through “Operation Cold Start” until February 6th from 6 am - 9 am. This initiative will see police officers patrolling for unattended idling vehicles to determine if they are locked and/or have the keys in the ignition. Officers will work to educate owners on the various ways they may keep their property safe. Please see the graphic on the left for tips to help keep vehicles safe.



HELP PREVENT WARM-UP THEFTS

- Use a remote starter or stay with your vehicle as it warms up
- Never leave your keys inside your vehicle
- Don't leave a running vehicle unattended
- Never leave children or pets inside a vehicle
- Use a steering wheel lock
- Keep your vehicle locked at all times
- Remove garage door openers from your vehicle

Garbage Curbside Pick-Up

Some residents have permanent garbage boxes at the end of their driveways and sometimes garbage pick-up is missed as a new driver doesn't recognize it as a garbage container.



E360 Solutions is asking residents to please identify their permanent boxes by putting signage on the outside that reads "Garbage" and "Recycling".

Garbage pick-up does take place on holiday Mondays. Please have your garbage visible at the curbside by **7 am**.

Collection will occur between **7 am - 5 pm**.

There is a **5 bag limit** per collection day.



Please don't wait to let us know that you've had your garbage or recycling missed. It's important that we let e360 know as soon as possible.

Has your water consumption unexpectedly increased on your last utility bill?

Check your toilet for leaks! A leaky toilet can waste up to 600+ cubic metres a month or 20 cubic metres a day.

Conduct a dye test on your toilet. Place food colouring in the tank at the back of your toilet. Do not flush. Wait and watch for 10 minutes. If the colour seeps into the toilet bowl then you have a leak.

Paying your Delburne accounts online

If you bank with ATB Financial, Scotiabank or Servus Credit Union, you can pay Delburne property tax and utility accounts online. Please make sure that you are paying the correct account. Property Tax account numbers start with **083** and then there are **5** digits. For Utility accounts enter the last **8** digits. The first **3** zeros are not needed but if your account ends with **3** zeros, please enter them, as this differentiates between a utility and property tax account. Thank you!

FRAUD PREVENTION FOR SENIORS

Protect yourself by being aware of the scams affecting senior Canadians:

Emergency/Grandparents Scam

Suspects contact seniors claiming that their grandchild or family member was in an accident or charged with an offence. Suspects will claim that they are law enforcement officials and advise the victim that a payment for bail is required immediately in order to avoid going to jail.

Prize Scam

Consumers are informed that they are a winner of a lottery or prize even though they have never purchased a ticket or entered to win. The victim will be asked to pay a number of upfront fees. No winnings are ever received.

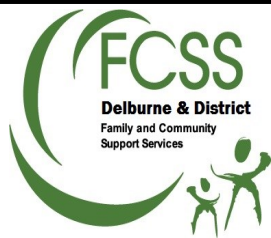
