EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY MARKET MANAGER DELBURNE FARMERS' MARKET 2023 SEASON

The Delburne Farmers' Market is sponsored by the Delburne & District Chamber of Commerce and is an accredited market through the Alberta Farmers' Market Association. As such, a minimum of 80% of our vendors are Albertans who make, bake or grow the products they sell; the remaining 20% may sell products that complement the market mix. Used goods or flea market products are not allowed.

Accountable to the Board of Directors, the market manager is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the market, working with market vendors and other stakeholders.

Responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

Work with the Board and vendors to ensure that market rules are applied in a fair and consistent manner.

Ensure vendors and market operations comply with local bylaws and provincial and federal legislation.

Ensure that all food vendors are in compliance with the market's permit holder requirements.

Maintain accurate and complete records on the market and vendors throughout the year including collection of vendors' food safety course certificates.

Actively recruit vendors to meet the optimal market mix, emphasizing "make it, bake it, or grow it".

Interest and passion for farmers' markets as a direct marketing channel and as a means to support and promote our local community.

Bylaw No. 1166/2020, being the Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw, provides for licensing, regulating, and confinement of dogs and cats in the Village of Delburne. All cats and dogs must be registered and licensed. Owners must provide their contact information along with a detailed description of their pet which includes their name, breed, sex and any other important information. Pet license fees are due every year by January 31st.

THE PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO LICENSE IS \$200 FOR THE FIRST OFFENCE.

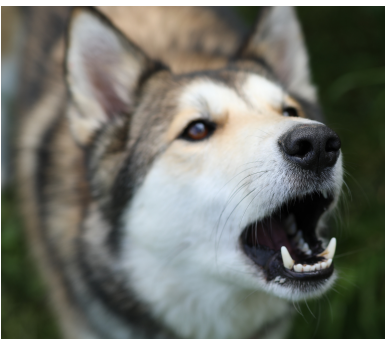

Barking Dogs

It is an offence to have a dog who barks constantly. The fine for the first offence is \$100 and then \$200 for the second offence.

Before taking action, Animal Control Services requires that a complainant track a barking dog for 5 days by providing the date and times that the barking started and ended.

Cat Trapping
Policy**



When it comes to feral or at-large cats within the Village, the public must adhere to the Cat Trapping Policy which is enforced and monitored by Animal Control Services. Before a resident can trap, they must call Animal Control Services as well as sign a Cat Trapping Agreement. This policy is in place to ensure that cats are handled humanely.

Cat Trapping Policy

1. Traps are supervised once per hour. If set overnight, traps must be inspected first thing in the morning before 9 am. If there is a cat in the trap, Animal Control Services must be called.
2. Traps cannot be set when the temperature is higher than +24°C or lower than +3°C.
3. Traps must be set in the shade and in an area that provides shelter from the rain.
4. Traps cannot be set from Friday to Sunday or on statutory holidays as it is difficult to arrange the timely pick-up and transport of the cat.
5. When taking possession of the trap, the person must make arrangements ahead of time with the Animal Control Officer.
6. If a cat is trapped in the late evening, the person must move the cat in the trap to an indoor space until the morning when it can be transported to the shelter.
7. No one can tease or torment a cat in the trap.
8. If a trapped cat cannot be taken to a shelter within a 12-hour period, the person must release the cat, unharmed, to be trapped at a future date.

Wildlife Warning

There have been many reports of wildlife coming into Delburne as deer and coyotes have been spotted these past few months. With the presence of coyotes roaming Delburne streets, residents are being warned to keep an eye on their pets.

According to Alberta Fish & Wildlife, coyotes may try to entice your dog away and attack it. Keeping your dog



leashed at all times is the best way to keep it safe. Do not let your dog play outside unsupervised and keep your cats indoors. We phoned Alberta Fish & Wildlife and they recommend purchasing a predator urine spray to use around your property. They would like to remind residents to ensure there are no attractants, such as pet food or litter and make sure garbage cans have secure lids. If you see an aggressive coyote or one that is sick and not moving, please call Alberta Fish & Wildlife through Report-A-Poacher at 1-800-642-3800.
