

Coming Soon! Village Office Will Accept Credit Cards as Payment

Credit cards will be accepted at the Village of Delburne office and online through our website to pay for property taxes, utility bills, business licenses, and more. At the April 23, 2023 Council meeting, a resolution was made to enter into an agreement with a company called *OptionPay* who provides credit card payment services at no-cost to the municipality.

In the past, the Village has received multiple requests to take credit cards as payment but since credit card companies charge such high user and set-up fees, the municipality did not want to require all taxpayers to be responsible to subsidize those fees through a property tax increase.

With *OptionPay*, a 3% processing fee will be applied to the individual user who chooses to pay by credit card and the municipality will not be charged any fees to offer the service. A "Pay Now" link will be provided on our website to pay online and a card reader will be at the Village office to pay in-person. This reputable service is used by other municipalities such as Red Deer County, Lacombe County, and the Town of Innisfail. The Village is setting up the *OptionPay* service with the anticipation of accepting credit card payments within the first few weeks of May.

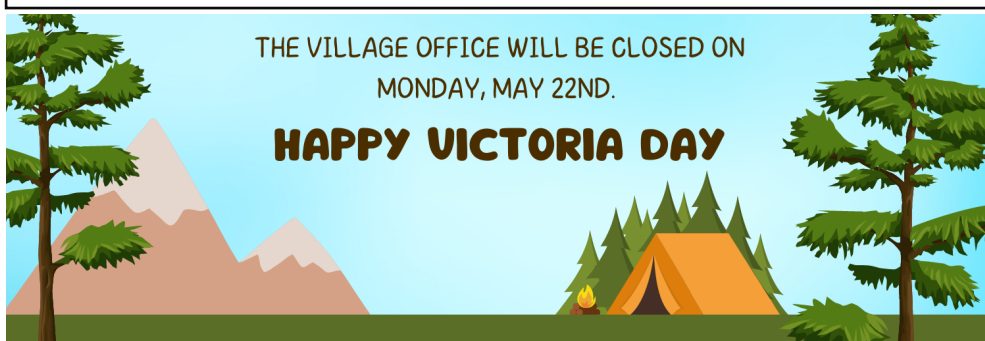
No Increase on 2023 Municipal Levy

At the April 25, 2023 Delburne Council meeting, *Bylaw No. 1187/2023*, being the Tax Rate Bylaw, was passed. Once again, there will be no increase to the general municipal levy. This year the provincial requisitions, which are education, seniors housing and police funding, have decreased. The municipality is responsible for collecting the requisitions on behalf of the Government of Alberta.

The 2023 Combined Assessment and Tax Notices are mailed out mid-May and property taxes are due by June 30, 2023. Here are the options to pay your property taxes:

- At the Village office by cash, cheque, debit, or credit card
- By mail to Box 341, Delburne, AB T0M 0V0: cheque
- Online Banking with ATB Financial, Servus Credit Union, or Scotiabank
- On our website www.delburne.ca by credit card through *OptionPay*
- Village office front door mail slot: cash or cheque

After July 1, 2023, a 15% late penalty will be applied to any outstanding balance on current taxes.

Please Do Not Flush Condoms



The Village of Delburne is asking citizens to not flush condoms down the toilet as it can damage the sewer system. Condoms have been found floating in the lagoons which hold the wastewater for the Village. Condoms are not biodegradable and can plug up the sewer system. A blockage is a costly repair and the Village only has so much money in the budget for emergency repairs. A high repair bill might result in an increase in the sewer fee on the monthly utility bill to cover the cost.

Outdoor Watering Restriction in Effect

From May 1st to September 1st, an outdoor watering restriction is in effect to conserve water and lessen the strain on our water pump station.

Properties North of Main St. (20th St.) should water on even numbered days.

Properties South of Main St. (20th St.) should water on odd numbered days.

Rain Barrel Rebate Program

Emergency Preparedness Week: May 7 - 13, 2023

Do you have an Emergency Kit?

During an emergency, grocery stores, pharmacies, gas stations, and banks may not be available. The right supplies can help you and your family (including pets) stay safe, warm and comfortable when disruptions occur. Below are some items for sheltering at home and emergency kits.

	Sheltering at Home (Minimum 14 days)	Emergency Kit (Minimum of 72 hours)
Food	- Canned goods like beans, soup & pasta. - Dry pasta, beans, rice or other grains. - Frozen foods such as fruit, vegetables, and meat.	Snacks like granola or energy bars, dried fruit or trail mix.
Water and Liquids (4 litres, per day, per person)	Minimum of 72 hours supply of water and electrolytes.	
Medical Supplies	- Adequate supply of any prescription drugs, such as heart medication, insulin for people with diabetes, and inhalers for people with asthma. - Over-the-counter medications such as pain relievers, cold medications, digestive aids, and anti-nausea. - Essential medical equipment with back-up power. - Back-up pair of glasses and/or extra contact lenses and solution.	
First Aid Kit	- Gauze, bandages, tape and antibacterial ointment. - Antiseptic wipes and protective gloves.	
Sanitation Supplies	- Hand sanitizer and wipes - Non-medical masks - Soaps and household cleaning supplies. - Personal hygiene products - Trash bags - Tissues, toilet paper, and paper towels.	Portable cleaning wipes, non-medical masks, hand sanitizer and trash bags.
Other Items	- Enough emergency cash to cover up to 2 weeks of incidental expenses, if possible. - Battery-powered or crank radio and flashlight, candles and matches or a lighter. - Vitamins and supplements - Space heaters and extra blankets. - Essential tools like a can opener or a multi-tool. - Extra batteries for household items and medical equipment. - Entertainment such as board games, movies, podcasts and books.	- Enough emergency cash to cover up to 72 hours of incidental expenses, if possible. - A multi-tool - Books and portable toys and games. - Electronics with a vehicle charger. - Extra blankets - Battery-powered or crank radio and flashlight, candles and matches or a lighter.

Keep Your Emergency Kit Updated

Use the change in seasons as a reminder to check your supplies and kits to ensure:

- Food and medications are not expired.
- Water is fresh
- Clothing still fits and is season appropriate
- Personal documents and credit cards are up-to-date
- Batteries are charged

You should also consider seasonal requirements when you update a kit.

In the Spring include:

- Bug spray, sunscreen, hats and lighter clothing

In the Fall include:

- Warm clothing and extra blankets

Be Fire Safe With Your Campfire!

Acceptable Fire Pit Rules

- Do not burn garbage!
- Do not have it located over any underground utilities or under any above ground wires
- A fire pit must be 3 metres away from a building, property line & combustible materials
- A fire pit must have enclosed sides made of bricks, concrete, or metal
- It must be equipped with a mesh screen with an opening no larger than 12.5 mm
- A height not exceeding 0.6 metres when measured from the surrounding grade to the top of the pit opening

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

To be held **JUNE 13, 2023 @ 6:30 PM**
VILLAGE OF DELBURNE MUNICIPAL OFFICE, Alberta

PURSUANT to sections 75.1, 75.5, 230 and 606 of the *Municipal Government Act*, Revised Statutes of Alberta 2000, Chapter M-26, as amended and Section 3 of the *Municipally Controlled Corporation Regulation*, A.R. 112/2019, the Council of the Village of Delburne in the Province of Alberta hereby gives notice of its intention to incorporate and control a corporation pursuant to the *Business Corporations Act*.

THE PURPOSE of the proposed Resolution is:

- A.** the Municipal Members each wish to become majority shareholders together with EQUUS REA Ltd. (“**EQUUS**”) as a minority non-municipality shareholder in a municipally controlled corporation delivering digital open-access broadband network services, “**Rural Connect Ltd.**” (also known as the “**Corporation**”);
- B.** The Municipal Members and EQUUS wish to structure the Corporation, by entering into a Unanimous Shareholder Agreement under certain terms and conditions as deemed fit by the Municipal Members and EQUUS to transact for the purpose of delivering broadband services through the Corporation, with these municipalities being shareholders in the Corporation;
- C.** As the Corporation is a limited private corporation, the municipally controlled corporation shall be structured pursuant to the *Business Corporations Act* (“**BCA**”) to act as the operating entity, to operate under the registered trade name “CONNECT” (the “**MCC**”);
- D.** The Municipality wishes to be a shareholder and jointly create and control the MCC under the BCA;
- E.** Pursuant to both the terms of Division 9 of Part 3 of the *Municipal Government Act* (the “**MGA**”) and the *Municipally Controlled Corporation Regulation* (the “**MCCR**”), a municipality may only incorporate and control a corporation incorporated pursuant to the BCA if certain preliminary steps are taken, which include, but is not limited to, holding a public hearing as stated herein;
- F.** The Council of the Municipality wishes to comply with all obligations under the MGA and the MCCR to cause the MCC to be validly constituted.

THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION will be disclosed at the public hearing:

- (1) the services the MCC intends to provide;
- (2) the names of the municipalities who will be the shareholders of the MCC;
- (3) the geographic locations in Alberta in which the MCC intends to provide services;
- (4) the projected rate structure for the cost of service; and
- (5) the market impact analysis of the MCC's provision of services.

TAKE NOTICE THAT Council has elected to hold the public hearing in accordance with the Village's procedural bylaw. The following rules shall apply:

- (1) Hearing Deliberations - The public hearing will be structured such that all who choose to participate, shall have the right to hear all discussions and those who have pre-registered, can make oral submissions;
- (2) Making Written Submissions – Written submissions will only be considered at the public hearing if they are emailed to karen.fegan@delburne.ca on or before the 13th day of June 2023 at 4:30 pm. Any written submissions emailed or submitted after this date will not be considered;
- (3) Pre-registration for speaking – we would ask that anyone who intends to make oral submissions at the hearing, pre-register to speak by sending an email to karen.fegan@delburne.ca and be registered to speak, on or before the 12th day of June, 2023 at 4:30 pm.
- (4) Speaking/procedure at hearing – We ask that:
 - The only attendees who shall be permitted to provide oral submissions or speak at the hearing are:
 - those who have either pre-registered with the Municipality to speak; or
 - if the chair of the hearing has invited people to speak at the hearing.
- (5) Improper Speaking/Disruption of hearing – In the event that someone speaks out of turn or is otherwise disruptive, the chair of the hearing reserves the right to remove that participant from the public hearing.

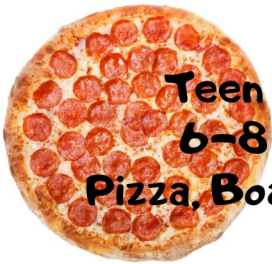

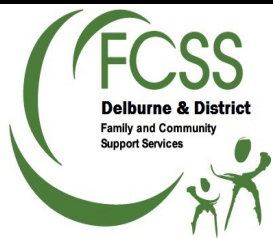

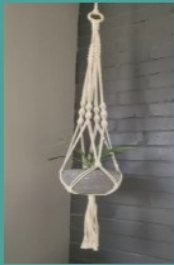
