

HAPPY CANADA DAY

The Village of Delburne's July 1st Canada Day celebrations are always a favourite event in our community! The Delburne Elks will be hosting their traditional Pancake Breakfast and the Canada Day Parade. Community organizations have collaborated to provide a variety of exciting activities such as the Tractor Pull, Market in the Park, Carnival Games, Gymkhana, a Soft Ball Tournament, and more! Partial Water Ban Changed to Outdoor Water Restriction

As of June 21, 2023, the Partial Water Ban for the Village of Delburne has been downgraded to an Outdoor Water Restriction. Residents must adhere to outdoor watering on their designated day:

Properties NORTH of Main St. (20th St.) may water on EVEN numbered days.

Properties SOUTH of Main St. (20th St.) may water on ODD numbered days.

Outdoor watering equipment may be used during authorized times on the designated day. Sprinklers and other continuous outdoor irrigation equipment can only be operated during the hours of 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm. Watering by hand, using a hose or can, is allowed on the property's designated days. The filling of pools and hot tubs continues to be prohibited.

Water conservation is a proactive planned priority for the Village of Delburne as outdoor watering restrictions occur annually during the months of May to September. This year, we have observed extremely dry conditions which has resulted in the excessive water consumption reaching an all-time high of 80,000 gallons a day. Due to the strict enforcement of the Partial Water Ban, consumption has reduced to 40,000 gallons a day. We thank everyone for their great efforts in reducing water usage.

The Village of Delburne will continue to monitor outdoor water usage to ensure that residents are adhering to the Outdoor Water Restriction. Any person violating the conditions of the restriction will be given a written warning and then they will be subject to fines as per section 24 of Bylaw No. 1175/2022. The fine for the first offence is \$100 and the second offence is a fine of \$500.

The Village of Delburne encourages residents to purchase a rain barrel to collect rain water for outdoor irrigation. The Rain Barrel Rebate Program gives a one-time \$50.00 credit on the monthly utility bill when a new rain barrel is purchased between May to October.

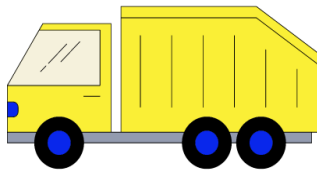

BYLAW BASICS

Get to know Delburne's Bylaws

Bylaw No. 1156/2019

The Nuisance (Property Maintenance) Bylaw

It is the property owner's responsibility to cut the grass on the boulevard and alley abutting the property.

- Section 3.4



Delburne Spray Park

The Spray Park has its own holding tank and system where the water is recycled and treated. Our Public Works team sends water samples out weekly to ensure that the water is safe to play in.

The main sensor at the park has been replaced. A tip to make it easier to activate the water is to wet your hand before touching the sensor.



Have fun at the Spray Park from 8 am to 9 pm, daily. Please help keep the spray pad free of debris so that the system does not get clogged. If there is a water issue, please call Public Works at 403-749-3607.

Be Fire Safe This Summer

Fire Bans and Restricted Fire Orders occur throughout the Summer when conditions are extremely dry. Stay informed by following the Village of Delburne on Facebook, checking out our website www.delburne.ca and the Alberta Fire Bans website www.albertafirebans.ca.



If you are having a recreational fire, make sure that you have an acceptable fire pit.

Bylaw No. 1133/2017, The Fire Services Bylaw describes an Acceptable Fire Pit as:

- A minimum of 3 metres clearance from the fire pit edge to the nearest building, property line or combustible material
- A height not exceeding 0.6 meters when measured from the surrounding grade to the top of the pit opening
- Equipped with a mesh screen with an opening no larger than 12.5 mm
- Enclosed sides made from bricks, concrete blocks, heavy gauge metal, or other non-combustible materials
- Not located over any underground utilities or under any above ground wires

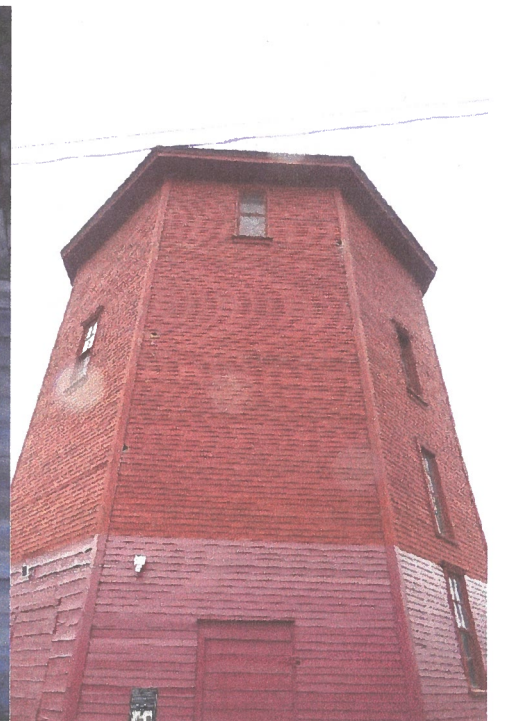
The Anthony Henday Museum in Delburne will be open to the public this summer and we encourage you to come for a visit. Volunteers will be called on again to help us in keeping the doors open for viewing. New exhibits have been set up during the fall & winter months, with more to come, as board members Wayne Wooden, Keith Nicholson, Dwayne Murray and Harvey Miner have been busily renovating the building at the back. Many of you will remember Dr. Warren having an office in town, as well as George Cameron and Jennie Saley operating a pharmacy on main street. Many items have been donated to the museum allowing us to replicate a doctor's office and a pharmacy, displaying these items that will bring back memories to you. Still needed for the Doctor is a stethoscope and a lab coat. There is also a music room in this building. Donations for paneling and ceiling tiles to finish the exhibit building would be appreciated.

For those of you that have not had the opportunity to tour the water tower, there are four floors of various themes. First floor is the coal mine display. Second floor is Jake's barbershop; a blacksmith shop; Smith's hardware store. The third floor is dedicated to the pioneer ladies, showing the various household appliances they used to keep a home: Treadle sewing machines, flat irons for ironing clothes, wringer washers for washing the laundry, displays of fine needlework and beautiful quilts. Lois Wooden and Shelly Nicholson spent many hours planning and arranging this floor. Fourth (top) floor displays an array of tools and hardware that the men had to use for their work on farms and businesses. Wayne's carpentry skills really shine on this floor.

On another note, the museum is holding a raffle as a fund-raiser, selling tickets at \$5 each, prize is a Weber barbecue. This is a donation from Chris and Natalie Warren of Warren Sinclair LLP, Red Deer, who have been supporters of various organizations in our community. Tickets are available from any museum board member, as well as at the museum and at the Servus Credit Union.
