*I watch my actions, for they become my habits.*

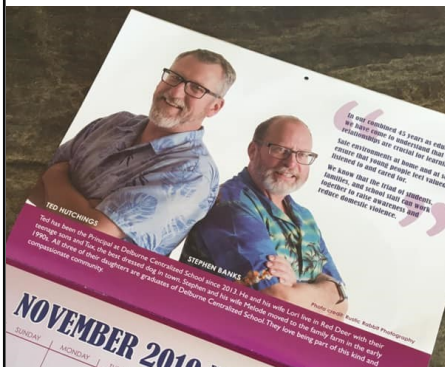
*I watch my habits, for they become my character.*

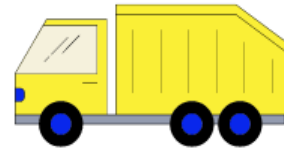

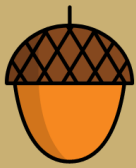

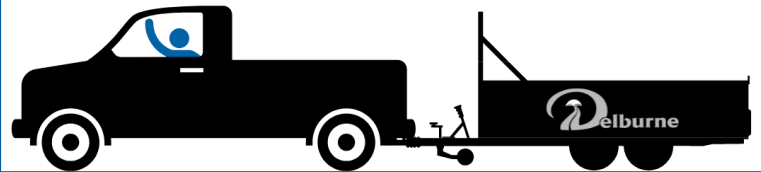

## Delburne Observes the National Day for Truth & Reconciliation



September 30th is the **National Day for Truth & Reconciliation** which recognizes the tragic legacy of residential schools, the missing children, the families left behind, and the survivors of these institutions. In recognition of the National Day for Truth & Reconciliation, the Village of Delburne has purchased the Survivor's Flag from the National Centre for Truth & Reconciliation which is based out of the University of Manitoba.



The Survivors' Flag is an expression of remembrance, meant to honour residential school Survivors and all the lives and communities impacted by the residential school system in Canada. Each element depicted on the flag was carefully selected by Survivors from across Canada, who were consulted in the flag's creation.

The Survivors' Flag will be raised at the Village of Delburne Municipal Office during the week leading up to September 30th.

Delburne Council and Staff will also be observing **Orange Shirt Day** which coincides with the National Day for Truth & Reconciliation on September 30th.

Orange shirts were purchased from the Orange Shirt Society which is a non-profit organization based in Williams Lake, BC.

Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission Residential School Commemoration Project. The Orange Shirt Society was founded by Phyllis (Jack) Webstad, a residential school survivor, and others to create awareness of the intergenerational impacts of residential schools and promote the concept of **"Every Child Matters."**

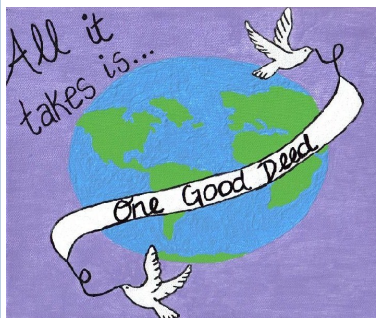

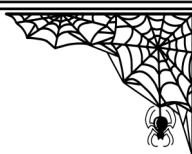

## Alberta RCMP encourage parents to not share personal information in Back to School social media posts

It has become common for parents to share images of their children alongside signs outlining personal details about them. The information usually includes their name, age, school, grade, and favourite things. Though the intentions are innocent, posting personal details can risk the safety and privacy of a child as the information can be used by individuals to identify, locate, and build a false sense of trust with them. A stranger can approach a child using personal details when claiming to know the child's parents.



### Back to School Safety Tips:

- Avoid specific details about your child. Use a simple sign that reads "First Day of School."
- Do not post images that include the name of the school your child attends.
- Take photos in undisclosed locations and do not use visible addresses such as house numbers and street names.
- Speak with your children about stranger danger and outline safety plans with them. Establish safe words and identify trusted adults.
- Talk to your children about online safety and have parental monitor software or activate parental security settings on their social media accounts.

Starting September 1, when you see first responders, tow trucks or highway maintenance vehicles with flashing lights stopped on the side of the road, you must move over to the far lane to give workers extra space. ## Reminder for Back to School Safety

School is back in session this September and the Alberta RCMP would like to share some tips to ensure that everyone stays safe this school year.



- Pay attention to posted 30 km/hr. speed limits.
- When a school bus is flashing its alternate red lights, stop and do not pass as children may be on or off-loading.
- Look out for children, especially during school operating hours. Kids can easily become distracted and unaware of their surroundings.
- Share the road with cyclists. Be patient when following and provide extra space when passing.
- When pedestrians are crossing the street, come to a complete stop and do not block the crosswalk with your vehicle. Ensure that pedestrians have cleared the road before proceeding.
