- If you are driving, pull over in a neighbourhood and do not block driveways, crosswalks or intersections.



## 10th Ave Maintenance



Council was pleased to hear positive feedback about the maintenance of 10th Ave at the September 11th meeting. A resident's letter mentioned how appreciative citizens were for the dust control and the lowered speed limit of 40 km/hr.

10th Ave is a frequently used by vehicles and pedestrians. Previously, a request was made to Council to lower the speed limit to make it safer. The Village paid Red Deer County to provide dust suppression to improve the conditions for those who walk the road, golf on hole four, and stay at the campground.

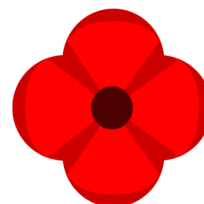

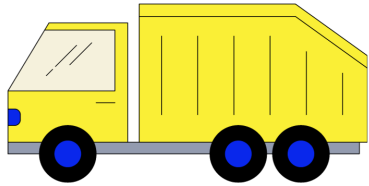

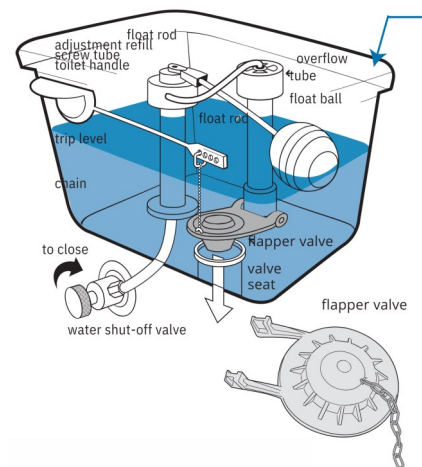
Has your water consumption unexpectedly increased on your last utility bill?

Please check your toilet for leaks!

A leaky toilet can waste up to 600+ cubic metres a month or 20 cubic metres a day. The flapper valve is the most common cause of running toilets.

Test your toilet!

Place food colouring in the back of the tank. Do not flush. Wait and watch for 10 minutes. If the colour seeps into the toilet bowl then you have a leak.



# Village of Delburne Information

## RECREATIONAL VEHICLE STORAGE

Delburne's *Land Use Bylaw No. 1190/2023* requires that recreational vehicles, motor homes, campers and boats be stored properly.

They must be parked no closer to the property line than 1.5 metres and they must be parked in the driveway.

Alternatively, they can be stored in the rear yard or on the side yard equal to or not going passed the front of the house.

Recreational vehicles parked in a Residential District may be used for living and sleeping accommodation only by bona fide tourists for a period no longer than 1 week, up to a maximum of 30 days per year.

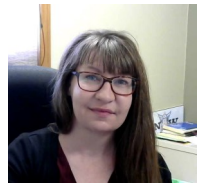

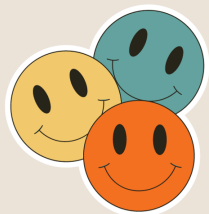
