2023 Poppy Campaign

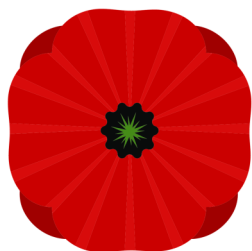
The Royal Canadian Legion encourages citizens to wear a Poppy to honour and remember Canada's Veterans.

The Village of Delburne is looking for a friendly, energetic individual to look after the duties of Community Hall Caretaker. The Community Hall Caretaker must be able to work responsibly and flexibly, consistent with the use of the Hall. This is a contracted position; invoices will be paid monthly.

The successful applicant will be responsible for the following, but not limited to:

- a. Cleaning and upkeep of the building including but not limited to, vacuuming, cleaning toilets, mopping floors, cleaning glass and mirrors, emptying garbage and recycle bins, washing walls as needed, wiping down refrigerators, stoves, and ovens.
- b. Ensure that the building remains tidy and that all furniture and equipment is appropriately stored after use and to report any missing inventory.
- c. Monitor stocks of cleaning supplies and other consumables, and to advise the Village Office admin staff to ensure they are replenished in good time.
- d. Receive and check goods and supplies and take them to the appropriate place for storage (cleaning products etc.).
- e. Ensure that all lights and heating are working effectively, changing light bulbs/strip lighting and occasionally working at various heights.
- f. Keep paths and entrances free of ice, snow, and debris to ensure the safety of Hall users.
- g. Turning on/off gas ovens and stove for events where they are needed.
- h. General maintenance and minor repairing needed from time to time.

Applicants' resumes can be submitted to the Village office and will be accepted up to 4:30 PM, Tuesday, November 14, 2023. Only those chosen for an interview will be contacted. If a suitable candidate is not found, the position will remain open until one is found.

Delburne Support Grant Committee Members Are Needed

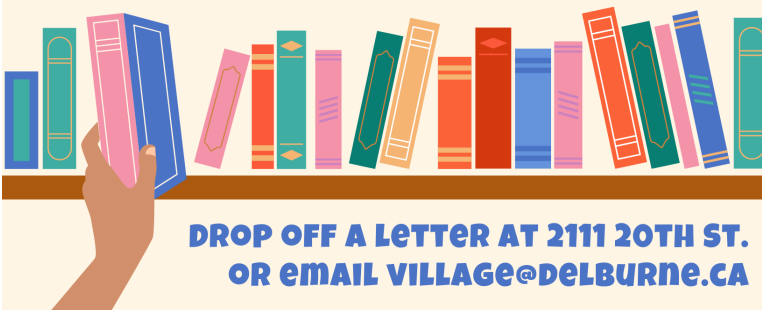

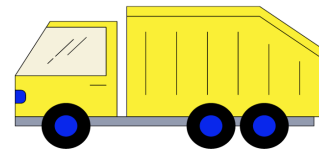

The Anthony Henday Historical Society will be hosting a rifle cartridge reloading workshop on December 2, 2023 at our museum in Delburne (2503 20th Street).

The workshop will cover all aspects of hand loading rifle ammunition; including cartridge components, tools and equipment, cleaning and preparing spent brass, handling powder and primers, and developing a custom load for your firearm.

Every step of the hand loading process will be demonstrated in detail, with ample time for questions and hands-on participation.

The event will start at 10:30 am, with a break for lunch (provided by the Historical Society) at noon. The fee to attend is \$50 for adults, or \$25 for 18 & under.

All proceeds will be donated to the Anthony Henday Museum.

Additional Member for the Three Hills RCMP Detachment

The Alberta RCMP have allocated funding to increase the resource strength in the Three Hills detachment by adding an additional regular member position at the Corporal rank. This new position will not only increase the number of resources serving the community, but it also enhances leadership within the detachment. The process to fill the position will take time but once employed, the Three Hills detachment will have seven officers: one Sergeant, one Corporal, and five Constables.



The RCMP continue to focus on crime reduction as all Albertans deserve to feel safe in their communities. The Three Hills (Provincial) Crime Statistics from January to September 2023 demonstrate that compared to last year, *Break & Enters have decreased by 12.9%, Theft of Motor Vehicles have decreased by 44.1%, and Theft under \$5,000 has decreased by 19.1%.* We want to acknowledge residents who report crime. We encourage citizens to report every crime to allow us to leverage reliable data to identify patterns and trends in criminal activities in our community.

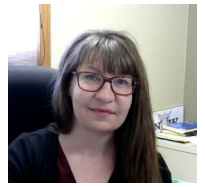
