

Property Tax Notices Will Be Mailed Out Mid-May

Delburne Council passed the *2024 Tax Rates Bylaw, Bylaw No. 1199/2024*, at the April 23rd meeting. For 2024, the General Municipal Levy has increased by 3% for both residential and non-residential properties. The increase was necessary as property assessment values have not kept up with inflation and the costs to deliver services have risen. Delburne property owners have not had an increase in the General Municipal Levy since 2016, which is reflected in the table below.

Over the last 9 years, increases to the total amount owing on property taxes can be attributed to a greater property assessment value and a rise in the Provincial requisitions.

The Government of Alberta sets the rates for Police Funding, Seniors Housing, and School levies and the Village of Delburne collects the funds to give to the Province.

Property Tax Notices will be mailed out mid-May with an insert explaining revenues and expenditures as well as payment options. Property taxes are due by June 30, 2024. A 15% late penalty will be applied on July 1, 2024.

Village Voice Submissions

New Water, Sewer, & Garbage Bylaw and Water Restrictions Policy

Alberta is at risk of droughts and water shortages. In an effort to conserve treated water, Delburne Council has amended their *Water, Sewer, & Garbage Bylaw* and passed a new *Water Restrictions Policy*.

The guidelines in the *Water Restrictions Policy* are in effect between May 1st and October 1st, or as designated by the Village. There will be four stages and each stage will have different restrictions associated with an activity depending on the state of water supply. Each stage will have varying levels of notification, restrictive actions, enforcement, and penalties associated with non-compliance.

The restrictions for watering lawns are no longer based on which side of 20th St. your property resides on. Even numbered addresses are permitted to water on even days of the month. Odd numbered addresses are permitted to water on odd days of the month. Watering is only permitted between 6:00 pm and 10:00 pm.

Bylaw No. 1197/2024, the Water, Sewer, & Garbage Bylaw, includes increased penalties for violation of section 9.4 which restricts and regulates when water may be used. The penalties will be: first offence \$250, second offence \$1000, and third or any subsequent offences \$2500.

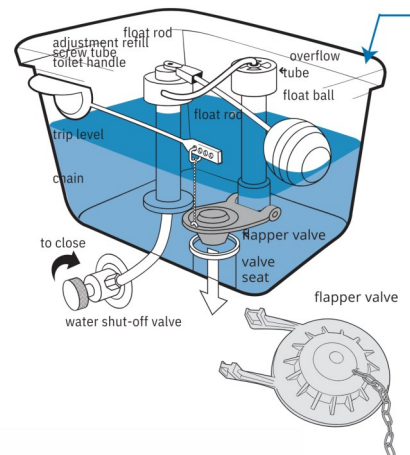
A leaky toilet can waste up to 20 cubic metres of water a day. The flapper valve is the most common cause of running toilets.

Vandalism at Main Street Park

The new pavilion has also been vandalized. The electrical receptacles have been damaged and recently we have received reports that youth have been trying to smash the concrete base.

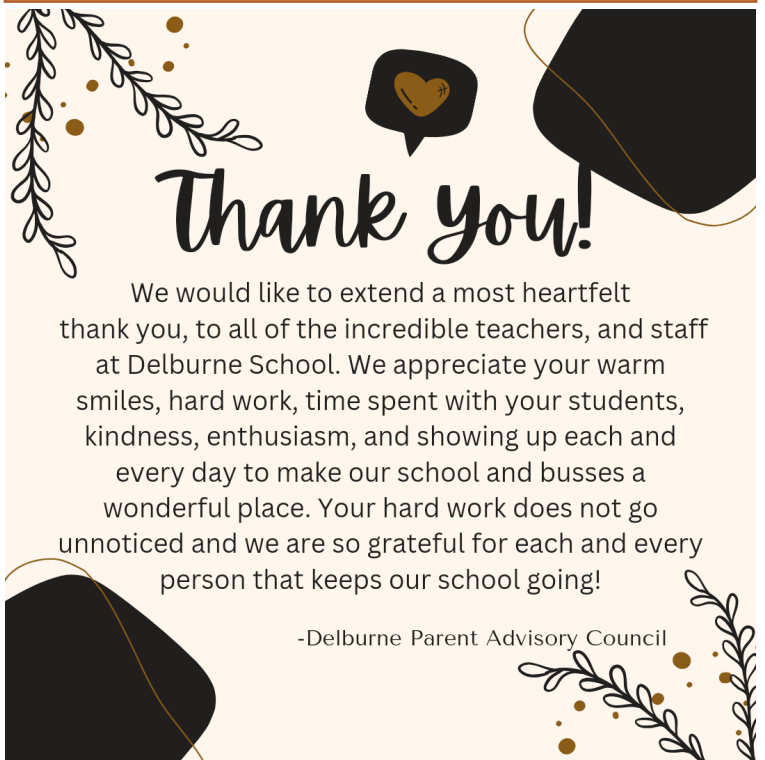
