

Pick-up is every Monday.



Fire Bans and Restricted Fire Orders occur when conditions are extremely dry. Red Deer County manages Fire Services for the Village of Delburne, so we follow the County's fire restrictions.

If you are having a recreational fire, make sure that you have an "Acceptable Fire Pit."

Bylaw No. 1133/2017, The Fire Services Bylaw describes an Acceptable Fire Pit as:

- A minimum of 3 meters clearance from the fire pit edge to the nearest building, property line or combustible material
- A height not exceeding 0.6 meters when measured from the surrounding grade to the top of the pit opening
- Equipped with a mesh screen with an opening no larger than 12.5 mm
- Enclosed sides made from bricks, concrete blocks, heavy gauge metal, or other non-combustible materials
- Not located over any underground utilities or under any above ground wires



On June 11, 2024, Red Deer County Protective Services Station 8 in Delburne responded to an emergency call due to downed powerlines caused by high winds from a storm cell moving through the area. Upon their return to Delburne, multiple calls were generated by the firefighters who found downed trees and powerlines within the village, due to the same cell. Upon discovery, crews worked quickly to ensure that there were no injuries or people trapped within affected buildings.

Off-Highway Vehicles Bylaw No. 1089/2011

No person shall operate an off-highway vehicle on any highway except as specifically provided for within this bylaw.

- Hours of operation of an off-highway vehicle is from 9 am to 9 pm.
- Any travel will be from the owners residence using the shortest route out of town.
- Use the roadway only and at a maximum speed of 10 km/hr.
- Operator must wear an approved "off-highway use" safety helmet.

Bylaw No. 1156/2019, the Nuisance Bylaw regulates property maintenance within the Village of Delburne.

It is the responsibility of the property owner or tenant to cut the grass and other vegetation on the property including the boulevard and alley to prevent it from growing to a height of more than 6 inches. - *Section 3.4*

Unightly properties will receive letters to remedy the conditions. Failure to comply to a written notice may result in Public Works cutting the grass at the cost of the property owner as per the *Fees & Charges Bylaw No. 1198/2024*.

Village of Delburne Water Restrictions

Water Restrictions Policy - Stage 3: Reduce Non-Essential Water Use

- Enforcement with automatic fine.
- Watering lawns, trees, shrubs, & gardens on designated days and times for a maximum of **30 minutes per day**.
- No pressure washing or hand washing of vehicles, surfaces, or buildings.
- No filling of pools, hot tubs, or water features. Topping up is permitted.



EVEN NUMBERED ADDRESSES ARE PERMITTED TO WATER ON EVEN DAYS OF THE MONTH

ODD NUMBERED ADDRESSES ARE PERMITTED TO WATER ON ODD DAYS OF THE MONTH

WATERING IS ONLY PERMITTED BETWEEN 6:00 PM AND 10:00 PM

Any person in violation of the *Water Restrictions Policy 1-014* will be subject to penalties as set in the *Water, Sewer, & Garbage Bylaw No. 1197/2024*.

Purchase a new rain barrel from a retail store and then apply to receive a one-time \$50 credit on your Delburne utility bill.

Outdoor Water Conservation Tips



Collect rainwater to use for outdoor plants



Check for leaks in outdoor pipes, faucets, and hoses



Plant drought tolerant vegetation. Add mulch to help reduce evaporation and keep more moisture in the soil



Clean with a broom instead of a hose



Water your lawn no more than necessary



Use a water-saving pool filter

The Village of Delburne contracts Animal Control Services to provide bylaw enforcement for Bylaw No. 1166/2020: The Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw.

Animal Control Services has a *Cat Trapping Policy* and they require a signed *Cat Trapping Agreement* to ensure that feral and at-large cats are treated humanely.

- Traps cannot be set:
- If the temperature is higher than +24°C or lower than +3°C
 - Fridays to Sundays and on Statutory Holidays

It is an offence to have a dog who barks constantly. The fine for the first offence is \$100 and then \$200 for the second offence.

Before taking action, *Animal Control Services* requires that a complainant track a barking dog for 5 days by providing the date and times that the barking started and ended.



Village awarded Grant for Lagoon System Upgrades

The Village of Delburne was successful with their application for the *Alberta Municipal Water/Waste Water Partnership (AMWWP)* Program to repair the lagoon system which holds waste water for the municipality.

Both the outlet and inlet structures are deteriorating and becoming blocked. For the health and safety of citizens and the environment, it is necessary to repair the lagoons. From MPE Engineering's *Lagoon Assessment Report*, the Village has developed a 3-stage plan to address the failing infrastructure with a projected total cost of \$6,980,000.

The funding was awarded for Stage 1 of the project which will address the most severely deteriorated structures at an estimated cost of \$480,000. As part of the AMWWP funding agreement, the Province will provide \$360,000 (75% of the cost) with the Village contributing \$120,000 (25% of the cost).


