

Village hosts Emergency Services Information Night



Village of Delburne Council and Emergency Services personnel gathered with residents on September 18th at the Delburne Community Hall. This night was an opportunity for citizens to address their concerns and ask questions related to policing and crime in our community. Sgt. Jamie Day, Detachment Commander for the Three Hills RCMP, discussed crime statistics and informed the public that Delburne is a safe community. Residents are encouraged to report any criminal activity directly to the RCMP. In an emergency call 9-1-1 and for a non-emergency call 403-443-5538.

Red Deer County Fire Services was on hand to give an update about Fire Station 8, which is located at 1925 22nd Ave in Delburne. Station 8 Platoon Chief Jeff Giesbrecht spoke about response times and the need for more paid-on-call firefighters for our area. He also discussed the frequent training and exercises carried out by the team so that they are prepared during an emergency.

Halloween Safety Tips



Choose the right costume

- Pick brightly coloured costumes that can be seen by motorists. Add reflective tape.
- Make sure masks fit properly so that your child can see and breathe easily.
- Choose costumes that can fit well and can be worn over warm clothing.

Stay secure while trick or treating

- Go trick or treating with your children until they are old enough to go with a friend.
- Tell your children to stay in well-lit areas and only visit homes with the lights on.
- Teach your children to be careful when crossing the street. Cross at a corner.

Avoid danger when decorating

- To avoid injuries, let children draw on the pumpkin and have an adult carve it.
- Place candles & jack-o-lanterns away from curtains. Do not leave them unattended.
- Use a small flashlight or battery candle to light your jack-o-lantern.

Be cautious with candy and toys

- Tell your children to not eat any treats until you have looked them over.
- Be careful of handing out treats that are potential choking hazards like hard candies.
- Throw out any candy that is damaged or unwrapped.





RECREATIONAL VEHICLE STORAGE IN DELBURNE

Section 5.8 of Delburne's Land Use Bylaw No. 1190/2023 requires that recreational vehicles, motor homes, campers and boats be stored properly.

They must be parked no closer to the property line than 1.5 metres and they must be parked in the driveway. Alternatively, they can be stored in the rear yard or on the side yard equal to or not going passed the front of the house.

Recreational vehicles parked in a Residential District may be used for living and sleeping accommodation only by bona fide tourists for a period no longer than 1 week, up to a maximum of 30 days per year.
