

No Municipal Tax Increase for 2025

On April 8th, Delburne Council passed *Bylaw #1207/2025* which has set the tax rates for this year. There are no increases to the general municipal levy for both residential and non-residential properties. The Village has seen a growth in property values as the assessment base has increased by 4.7%.

Annual assessments are conducted based on the market value of a property on July 1st of the previous year for the current tax year. For the 2025 tax year, properties are assessed by their value on July 1, 2024. Property Assessments were mailed out on March 4th. Citizens can view the Assessment Roll at the Village Office or online: www.delburne.ca/about-delburne/property-taxes.

The deadline to file an assessment appeal is May 9th. The appeal fee is \$50 for a residential property and \$250 for a non-residential property. An appeal form can be obtained at the Village office or online at www.alberta.ca/municipal-property-assessment-complaints-and-appeals.

Before filing an appeal, we recommend discussing your assessment with our Village Assessor Kevin Bohlken, of Wild Rose Assessment Services, at 403-343-3357.

Property tax notices will be mailed out mid-May, with payment due on or before June 30, 2025. A 15% late penalty will be applied on July 1, 2025.

Exciting Updates for the Village of Delburne's Recycling Program

Circular Materials will be taking the lead managing the Village of Delburne's recycling program. This transition brings fresh opportunities to enhance our community's commitment to sustainable practices. Residents can look forward to the same reliable service, with added benefits of improved efficiency and a stronger focus on environmental stewardship.

On October 3, 2022, the Alberta Extended Producer Responsibility Regulation was approved for single-use products, packaging, and paper products. Circular Materials is operating as the not-for-profit Producer Responsibility Organization (PRO) in Alberta that supports producers in meeting their obligations under the Regulation.

What does Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) mean?

EPR is a framework in which producers (businesses that supply paper and packaging to residents) are responsible for managing the end-of-life management of these materials. EPR enables innovation, operational efficiencies, increased standard levels, and access to materials. It is recognized as one of the most effective mechanisms to improve recycling rates.

What does this transition mean for residents?

During this time, Albertans will not notice any differences to their recycling schedule and they will still be able to recycle the same materials as before. Property owners will see a reduction on their Delburne Utility Bill as they will no longer be charged a recycling fee. This change will be reflected on the April's services bill which is processed in May.

Village of Delburne Outdoor Water Restrictions

Outdoor water restrictions are in effect from May 1st to October 31st every year as outlined in the Water Restrictions Policy No. 1-014. There are 4 stages of restrictions which are defined by specific metrics or triggers in relation to our water supply.

Starting May 1st, Stage 1 will be in effect but this is subject to change. Residents will be updated on our website, Facebook, newsletters, and Village signage.

Stage 1: Monitoring & Observation

- Watering lawns, trees, shrubs, & gardens on designated days and times.
- No restrictions for filling of pools, hot tubs, or water features.
- No restrictions for cleaning outdoor surfaces, driveways, decks, and buildings.
- It is recommended that vehicles be washed at a commercial car wash.



WATERING IS PERMITTED BETWEEN 6:00 PM AND 10:00 PM
EVEN NUMBERED ADDRESSES ARE PERMITTED TO WATER ON EVEN DAYS OF THE MONTH
ODD NUMBERED ADDRESSES ARE PERMITTED TO WATER ON ODD DAYS OF THE MONTH

Get an Emergency Kit

In an emergency you will need some basic supplies. You may need to get by without power or tap water. Be prepared to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours.

You may have some of the items already, such as a flashlight, battery-operated radio, food and water. The key is to make sure they are organized and easy to find. Would you be able to find your flashlight in the dark?

Make sure your kit is easy to carry. Keep it in a backpack, duffel bag, or suitcase with wheels, in an easy-to-reach, accessible place, such as your front hall closet. Make sure everyone in the household knows where the kit is located.

Basic Emergency Kit

- Water - at least two litres of water per person per day. Include small bottles that can be carried easily in case of an evacuation order.
- Food that won't spoil, such as canned food, energy bars, and dried foods (remember to replace food and water once a year).
- Manual can opener.
- Crank or battery-operated flashlight (and extra batteries).
- Crank or battery-operated radio (and extra batteries).
- First aid kit.
- Special items such as prescription medications, infant formula, equipment for people with disabilities.
- Extra keys to your car and house.
- Some cash in smaller bills, such as \$10 bills and change.
- A copy of your emergency plan and contact information.

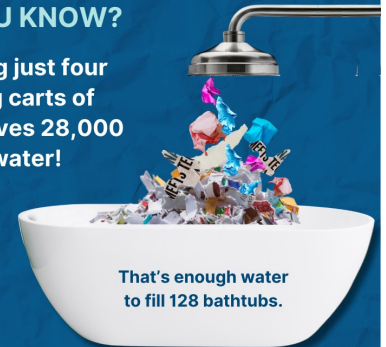

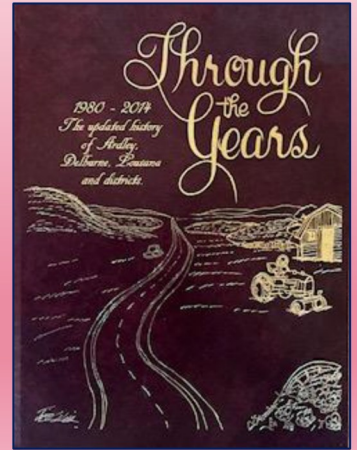
