From June 16, 2025, to June 30, 2025, Three Hills RCMP responded to 104 events/calls for service. These included various levels of criminal, traffic and public assistance related files. Below is a variety of calls for service received and investigations conducted by the Three Hills RCMP:

Shoplifting at IGA

On June 19, 2025, at 12:26 PM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of a theft from the IGA in Three Hills. A witness saw a male put a package of meat in his jacket and walk away from the product stand. IGA staff was notified and the male was found in possession of the stolen meat product. Police identified the male, and he was subsequently arrested and released from custody on an Undertaking.

A 56-year-old Three Hills resident has been charged with theft under \$5000 and is scheduled to appear in court at the Drumheller Court of Justice on July 18, 2025.

Contraband Cigarettes

On June 20, 2025, at approximately 4:07 PM, Three Hills RCMP conducted a traffic stop with a vehicle for speeding on Highway 21 in Kneehill County. The driver was found in possession of illegal unstamped cigarettes. The cigarettes were seized, and the driver, a 51-year-old male from Sherwood Park was issued a Violation Ticket for possess less than or equal to 400 cigarettes or grams of tobacco not marked for tax-paid sale.

Disobey Court Order

On June 23, 2025, at approximately 12:40 PM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of an indecent act committed by a male and female in a public place in Three Hills. Police patrolled the area and found the male and female suspects walking together in town. Police determined there was a court order that prohibited contact between the male and female. Both were subsequently arrested and released from custody on Undertakings with conditions. Police attempted to further investigate the indecent act; however, there was insufficient evidence to proceed.

A charge of Disobey order of the court will be submitted to the Crown for pre-charge approval for a 36-year-old female from Three Hills and a 29-year-old male from Airdrie.

Flight from Police

On June 26, 2025, at approximately 2:10 PM, Three Hills RCMP attempted a traffic stop with a vehicle driving erratically on Highway 590 near Elnora. The vehicle fled from police; however, the driver was identified. The driver was later located; arrested, and released on an Appearance Notice.

A criminal charge of flight from police is expected and will be submitted to the Crown for pre-charge approval. The driver, a 45-year-old resident from Elnora, also held a suspended drivers license.

Campground Disturbance

On June 26, 2025, at 3:33 AM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of a disturbance at the Three Hills Campground. A male banged on the door of a camper and fled in a grey car. Three Hills RCMP learned of a similar incident that occurred on June 23, 2025, where a male banged on the door of a camper and yelled. Three Hills RCMP were unable to locate the male, and he is described as approximately 5'4 and is believed to be associated to a dark colored SUV.

Paving Scam

On June 30, 2025, at 3:12 PM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of a possible paving scam in Three Hills. The complainant was visited at her house by a male who offered services for microsurfacing and to reseal her driveway. The male said his name was "Jim", and he provided the complainant with a verbal quote. The complainant asked for a written quote; however, the male left without providing one. The complainant was provided with a flyer that did not contain a business name. It outlined sealcoating services and had a telephone number on it.

This incident resembles an Alberta wide asphalt paving fraud. Alberta.ca outlines the details of the fraud. The scammers are said to target residential, commercial, and farming residents in small towns and rural communities. They will state they have leftover material from a recent paving project and will offer to pave a driveway for a discounted price. The victim is instructed to stay off of the driveway for a period of time, and when they begin to use it again, it will start to crack and disintegrate.

Public Education and Awareness

Tips for keeping your house and yard safe

Three Hills RCMP encourages residents to consider incorporating Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) strategies into their plans for home and yard security. CPTED is a proactive approach to prevent crime and enhance your overall safety. We suggest the following strategies as part of your regular home and property maintenance:

- Install motion-sensor lights, porch lighting and backyard lights to make it harder for criminals to go unseen
- Install video surveillance cameras to record unwanted visitors
- Trim trees and shrubs and maintain your landscaping to prevent ideal hiding spots for criminals
- Install fences, gates and clear boundaries to send a message of care and control
- Get to know your neighbours to keep more eyes on the street to ensure a safer neighbourhood.

Three Hills RCMP encourages citizens to attend the detachment to pick up a pamphlet that outlines simple steps for protecting your home.

Video surveillance cameras can act as a deterrent as well as provide police with valuable evidence if your home is broken into or items are stolen from your property. Three Hills RCMP encourages to research and pick a camera that matches your environment and expectations. Some systems do not automatically store footage, but rather only give real-time alerts. You may need to pay for a cloud storage plan. Citizens are encouraged to maintain their system once installed and familiarize themselves with how to use it and access the video recordings. Video evidence can make all the difference for a police investigation.
