

Registration for the Alberta Permanent Electors Register is now closed. Voters who are not registered or need to update their address will need to register in person at the voting station.

If your name appears on Alberta's
Permanent Electors Register, you will need
one piece of government issued
identification that contains a photograph.
Ex: drivers license, passport, or Alberta
Identification Card.

If you are not on the Permanent Electors
Register, you must fill out a form at the
voting station, provide government issued
identification, and proof of address such as a
utility bill. If you do not have acceptable
identification of your current address,
another elector may vouch for you.
Scrutineers are prohibited from vouching.

Beware of Service Scams

The Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre is warning citizens to beware of service scams where the fraudster calls and claims to be from an internet, cable, or cellphone service provider. They offer a deal that's too good to be true.

The fraudsters proceed to ask for the victim's personal information including their Social Insurance Number and Driver's License number.

They will then:

- Use your personal information for identity fraud
- Order a cellphone using your identity
- Order a cellphone and have it shipped to the victim but then tell you it was the wrong cellphone and you need to ship it back to the criminal's address

If you get a call from your service provider, tell them that you will call them back and end the call. Look up the legitimate phone number for the company and communicate with them directly by always making the outgoing call.

Protect yourself. Do not give out personal information such as your address, birth date, Social Insurance Number, credit card, or banking information.




Recreational Vehicle Storage

Section 5.8 of Delburne's *Land Use Bylaw No. 1190/2023* requires that recreational vehicles, motor homes, campers, and boats be stored properly.

They must be parked no closer to the property line than 1.5 metres. They must be parked in the driveway and not on the street. Alternatively, they can be stored in the rear yard or on the side yard equal to or not going passed the front of the house.

Recreational vehicles parked in a Residential District may be used for living and sleeping accommodation only by bona fide tourists for a period of no longer than 1 week, up to a maximum of 30 days per year.
