From September 16, 2025, to September 30, 2025, Three Hills RCMP responded to 87 events/calls for service. These included various levels of criminal, traffic and public assistance related files. Below is a variety of calls for service received and investigations conducted by the Three Hills RCMP:

Fail to Remain at Accident

On September 16, 2025, at 9:16 PM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of a single vehicle collision on Highway 583 in Kneehill County. Police attended with the fire department and paramedics, and they found a semi-truck on its side in the ditch. The driver was no longer on scene. Police investigated the collision and were able to identify the driver. The driver admitted to police she had been texting while driving prior to the collision.

A 44-year-old female from Leduc County has been charged with the following:

- Driver in accident fail to remain at or return immediately to the scene
- Drive vehicle on highway while holding, viewing or manipulating hand-held device

She is scheduled to appear at the Drumheller Court of Justice on October 24, 2025.

Criminal Harassment

On September 18, 2025, at approximately 1:41 PM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of harassment committed by a female suspect in Delburne. The victim informed police he had been subjected to numerous unwanted messages and voicemails, as well as threats to his property. Police investigated and learned the suspect had also broken into the victim's residence on two occasions while he was inside. She was also bound by court-imposed conditions.

The Crown has approved the following charges for a 27-year-old female from Red Deer:

- Criminal harassment
- Two counts of Break & enter
- Uttering threats
- Fail to comply with conditions

The charges have not yet been sworn; therefore, the name of the female cannot be provided.

Impaired Drivers

On September 21, 2025, at approximately 1:57 PM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of an erratic driver leaving Red Deer on Highway 595 in Red Deer County. Police located the vehicle in Delburne and detected signs of alcohol consumption by the driver. The female driver provided a sample of her breath, resulting in a numerical result. The driver held a GDL driver's license.

- A 17-year-old female from Delburne was issued an Immediate Roadside Sanction, including a 30-day license suspension and 7-day vehicle seizure/impound.

On September 23, 2025, at approximately 7:15 PM, Three Hills RCMP conducted a traffic stop with a vehicle in Three Hills. The vehicle had stopped in the middle of an intersection and failed to signal when it turned onto another street. Police detected signs of alcohol consumption by the driver, and he provided a sample of breath, resulting in a FAIL result.

- A 46-year-old male from Kneehill County was issued an Immediate Roadside Sanction, including a 90-day license suspension and 30-day vehicle seizure/impound.

On September 25, 2025, at approximately 12:28 AM, Three Hills RCMP conducted a traffic stop with a vehicle in Three Hills. Police detected signs of alcohol consumption by the driver; however, he refused to provide a sample of his breath.

- A 40-year-old male from Fort McMurray was issued an Immediate Roadside Sanction, including a 90-day license suspension and 30-day vehicle seizure/impound.

Break & Enter

On September 22, 2025, at 1:30 PM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of a break and enter to a residence in Trochu. The victim told police he noticed items missing from the house, including his wallet, bank cards, electronics and jewellery when he returned home. The victim's identification was found in a nearby alley.

Public Education and Awareness

Vehicle Theft Prevention Program

Three Hills RCMP Crime Reduction Unit has developed a vehicle theft prevention initiative. The initiative includes a Vehicle Report Card which will be utilized by officers on patrol in the communities within the detachment area. The report card will give a vehicle a pass or fail grade based on certain criteria and observations made by officers. A vehicle can fail visual inspection because the following were visible:

- Backpack/Purse/Briefcase
- Cash/Coins
- Electronics
- GPS/Radar Detector
- Jewelry
- Tools

A vehicle can also receive a fail because the window(s) were left open and/or the doors were left unlocked. The report card will be left in a non-conspicuous spot on your vehicle, such as on the windshield. If you find a report card on your vehicle, do not be alarmed, Three Hills RCMP officers are proactively working to prevent vehicle thefts.

Vehicle theft and theft of contents from a vehicle are often crimes of opportunity. Three Hills RCMP asks the public to remove valuables from their unattended and vehicle and urges everyone to lock the doors and remove the keys. With winter fast approaching, it is common practice to leave a vehicle idling; however, this can leave it susceptible to theft. Please use remote start if available, and do not leave your keys in the ignition with the doors unlocked.
