From October 16, 2025, to October 31, 2025, Three Hills RCMP responded to 93 events/calls for service. These included various levels of criminal, traffic and public assistance related files. Below is a variety of calls for service received and investigations conducted by the Three Hills RCMP:

**\*\*UPDATE\*\* Assault with a weapon**

On October 14, 2025, Three Hills RCMP received a report of an assault with a weapon at a rural property in Red Deer County. Police learned a pellet gun was discharged, and a child was struck in the head by a pellet.

Police continued the investigation and learned other children had also been shot with what was now determined to be a BB gun.

On October 24, 2025, Three Hills RCMP executed a Warrant to Search at the rural property in Red Deer County, and the BB gun believed to have been used was located and seized. The male suspect was arrested, and he was later released on an Undertaking with conditions.

Several charges for assault with a weapon will be submitted to the Crown for approval.

**Public Intoxication**

On October 16, 2025, at 12:29 PM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of an intoxicated female laying on the street in Three Hills. Police located the female, and she

was found on the sidewalk in possession of open liquor. The female was intoxicated, and she was arrested and later released when she was able to care for herself.

On October 17, 2025, at 1:31 PM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of an unwanted person at a business in Three Hills. Police located the same female from October 16, 2025, laying on the grass. She was again found in possession of open liquor and was again intoxicated. The female was arrested and later released when she was able to care for herself.

### **Impaired Driver**

On October 17, 2025, at 10:19 AM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of an impaired driver in Three Hills. A witness had seen the male suspect in a business, and he displayed signs of being intoxicated. The witness provided police with a description of the suspect, as well as a description of his vehicle and the license plate.

Police located the suspect's vehicle at his residence in Three Hills, and the officer noted signs of alcohol consumption. The male provided a sample of his breath, and the result was a FAIL.

A 38-year-old male from Three Hills was issued an Immediate Roadside Sanction, including a 90-day license suspension and 30-day vehicle seizure/impound.

### **Wellbeing Check**

On October 26, 2025, at approximately 4:58 PM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of a welfare concern in Three Hills. The complainant assisted a male with his vehicle; however, the male appeared confused. The complainant called police because he was concerned about the male's mental state. Police attended the scene and, with the assistance of EMS, determined the male was suffering a medical crisis.

While on scene, police prevented the male from reversing his vehicle into another parked vehicle. The male was issued an Immediate Roadside Sanction – 24-hour license suspension, and he was cared for by EMS.

## **Public Education and Awareness**

### **Hunting and Firearm Safety Guidelines**

RCMP Media Relations provide the following safety tips to help make hunting season safe, responsible, and enjoyable:

- Inspect and check your hunting equipment before heading out to make sure it is in safe working order.
- Avoid high-traffic areas and clearly marked trails where non-hunters may also be enjoying the outdoors
- Wear bright or high-visibility clothing, ideally in orange or another standout color, to ensure you're visible to others.
- Checking that you have the necessary licenses, tags, and permits.
- Respecting any designated zones and protected wildlife areas.
- Follow all hunting season start and end dates as set by local authorities.
- Be Prepared for Emergencies. Carry a first aid kit, a fully charged phone, or a communication device and always inform someone of your hunting location

In addition to the safety tips, there are guidelines and regulations for the transportation of restricted and non-restricted firearms. It is important to know and understand these to ensure compliance with the law and safety for everyone.

The following are the transportation requirements for firearms:

- ***Transportation of non-restricted firearms***
  - Firearm must be **unloaded**
  - **If left in an unattended vehicle**, the firearm must be locked in the trunk/similar compartment of the vehicle; or, if the vehicle does not have a trunk/similar compartment, the firearm must be out of sight inside the locked vehicle
- ***Transportation of restricted/prohibited firearms***
  - Firearm must be **unloaded**
  - Make the firearm inoperable with a secure locking device, such as a trigger lock; and remove the bolt or bolt carrier from an automatic firearm (if removable); and lock the firearm in a sturdy, opaque container that cannot easily be broken into
  - **If left in an unattended vehicle**, the firearm must be locked in the trunk or similar compartment; or if the vehicle does not have a trunk/similar compartment, the firearm must be out of sight inside the locked vehicle
  - Obtain an **Authorization to Transport** (call 1-800-731-4000)
- ***Exception to storage and transportation***
  - In a remote wilderness area, a non-restricted firearm can be kept handy and unlocked, but it must be **unloaded**. Ammunition can be kept handy also. **If left in an unattended vehicle**, the firearm must be locked in the trunk or similar compartment; or if the vehicle does not have a trunk/similar compartment, the firearm must be out of sight inside the locked vehicle

The RCMP would like to remind the public to treat every firearm as if it is loaded. This simple rule can save lives and ensure a responsible hunting season. It is also important to note that failure to comply with the requirements could result in criminal charges and loss of your firearms and firearms license.
