Meetings are open to the public. Enter from the front door, go left down the hallway and Council Chambers is the first door on the right. Take a seat.

If you wish to speak to Council, please book an appointment to present at a future meeting. Alternatively, you can have an issue addressed by writing a letter to Council.

Letters and delegation appointments for the meeting agenda must be submitted/booked at least **7 days** prior to the next meeting.

Village Voice Submissions: The deadline for the next issue is the **third Monday** of the current month. Submissions must meet the requirements as outlined in the *Municipal Newsletter Policy*. Please submit by emailing villagevoice@delburne.ca or drop off your poster at the Village Office.



Property Tax Reminder

Any outstanding balance on property taxes must be paid on or before **December 31, 2025**.

A **10% penalty fee** will be applied on **January 1, 2026**.

If your **utility account arrears** have been transferred to your property tax account, the balance owing will receive a **10% penalty fee**, if not paid in full by **December 31, 2025**.

Attention property owners on the **Monthly Payment Plan: Utility account arrears** that have been transferred to your property tax account do not get factored into your monthly payment. The **transferred utility arrears** will receive a **10% penalty fee**, if not paid in full by **December 31, 2025**.

2026 PROPERTY TAX PAYMENT PROGRAMS

TAX INSTALLMENT PAYMENT PLAN

Pay your property taxes monthly through automatic withdrawal from your bank account.

Automatic withdrawals occur on the last day of the month.

Signed paperwork is required along with a void cheque or automatic withdrawal form.

Participants remain in the program every year until they decide to cancel.

TAX PREPAYMENT DISCOUNT PLAN

Receive a 4% discount on the municipal levy by paying your 2026 property taxes in full between January 1st to 31st.

The discount is based on the previous year's levy and it will be adjusted prior to taxes being levied in May 2026.

The 4% discount cannot be applied to the Provincial requisitions which are police funding, seniors foundation, and school levies.

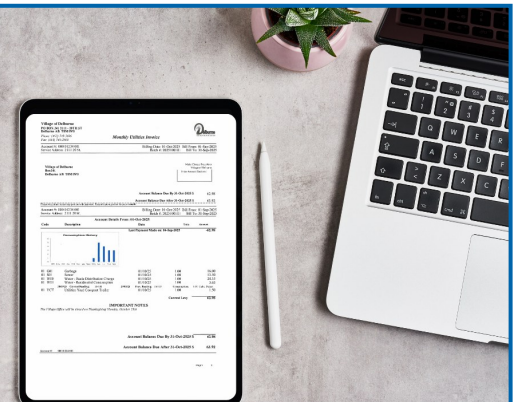

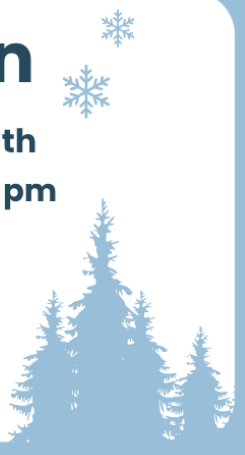

Wipes do not decompose after they are flushed and this can clog our sewer system which is costly to repair.

The only item that should be flushed is **toilet paper.**

Snow Removal Reminder

Property owners are responsible for clearing snow and ice from sidewalks that border their property.

As a courtesy, Public Works will clear the snow off of the sidewalks on Main Street, in the commercial area, as time and conditions permit. Commercial property owners are still responsible for snow clearing if the snowfall continues or when Public Works cannot get it done.



Please do not dispose of snow by moving it from your property or sidewalk and onto municipal property. Fines for moving snow onto streets or alleys are contained in the *Traffic Control Bylaw*.

Three Hills RCMP are reminding motorists about new online collision reporting option

As colder weather and winter driving conditions set in across Alberta, the Three Hills RCMP is reminding drivers to take extra care on the roads and to be aware of a new way to report certain vehicle collisions online. The Government of Alberta recently introduced **Report My Collision**, an online tool that allows eligible drivers to submit information about minor, property-damage collisions without attending a police detachment or collision reporting centre. This service is intended to make the reporting process easier and faster for drivers while helping police focus on more serious incidents.

To use the online system, drivers must have a valid Alberta driver's license, an Alberta.ca account, and the collision must have taken place within Alberta. Only passenger vehicles are currently eligible, while collisions involving commercially registered vehicles still require in-person reporting.

Drivers can use **Report My Collision** for certain single-vehicle incidents, including:

- When a vehicle strikes an animal;
- When a vehicle hits an object such as a post or fence, but not another vehicle;
- When a vehicle slides off the road; or
- When a parked vehicle is damaged in a hit and run and there are no witnesses or supporting evidence.

Any collision involving injuries, fatalities, multiple drivers, or identifiable suspect information must still be reported in-person at the nearest police detachment. For more details or to start a report, visit report-my-collision.alberta.ca.

The Three Hills RCMP would also like to remind drivers of some important steps to follow if you are involved in a collision this winter season:

- Check that everyone is safe. If anyone is injured or if a driver appears impaired, call 911.
- If possible and safe, move vehicles off the roadway to avoid blocking traffic or causing additional collisions.
- Turn on hazard lights and place cones or warning triangles to alert other motorists.
- Do not stand between or behind vehicles, especially on slippery roads.
- Take photos of the damage and the scene, as these are required when filing a report online.
- Exchange driver and insurance information. Take reasonable steps to prevent further vehicle damage while waiting on scene.

Beware of **Caller ID Spoofing** where scammers manipulate the caller ID to display a familiar local number to trick you into answering. Do not answer. Let the call go to voicemail.

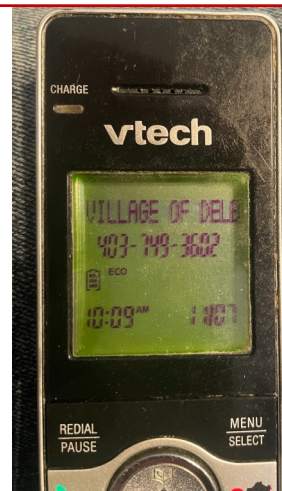
If you do accidentally answer the call, do not give out your personal information or allow access to your devices.
