From January 1, 2026, to January 31, 2026, Three Hills RCMP responded to 167 events/calls for service. These included various levels of criminal, traffic and public assistance related files. Below are a variety of calls for service received and investigations conducted by the Three Hills RCMP:

Impaired Driver – Refusal to Comply with Demand

On January 4, 2026, at approximately 2:56 PM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of driver operating a vehicle without a valid driver's license. Police located the vehicle in Three Hills and detected signs of alcohol consumption by the driver. The driver was provided with a lawful breath demand; however, he failed to comply.

A 78-year-old male from Three Hills was issued an Immediate Roadside Sanction. His driver's license was suspended and his vehicle towed/impounded.

Personating a Peace Officer

On January 8, 2026, at approximately 2:00 PM, Three Hills RCMP located a vehicle parked at a residence in Elnora that resembled an unmarked police vehicle. Police investigated and determined the vehicle had previously been reported speeding on the highway with blue lights flashing.

Police seized the vehicle and searched it under the authority of a search warrant. Police style equipment was located inside and was subsequently removed.

The matter is still under investigation, and no further information will be provided.

Impaired Driver – Commercial Vehicle

On January 11, 2026, at approximately 6:34 PM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of a semi-truck stuck in the driveway of a rural property in Kneehill County. The driver went to the residence on the property and banged on the door. The complainant believed the driver was intoxicated.

Police attended the scene and detected signs of alcohol consumption by the driver. The driver provided a sample of his breath, and the result was a Fail.

A 24-year-old male from Kindersley, Saskatchewan, was issued an Immediate Roadside Sanction. His driver's license was suspended and his vehicle towed/impounded.

Unlawfully in Dwelling House

On January 11, 2026, at approximately 7:28 PM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of a theft from a residence in Three Hills. Police determined a female suspect had unlawfully entered the home of a previous domestic partner and stole various items. The victim was inside at the time of the offences.

A 30-year-old female from Calgary has been charged with being unlawfully in a dwelling house and theft under \$5000.

Public Mischief

On January 13, 2026, at 11:10 AM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of possible harassment and false allegations made by a male against his former domestic partner. Police investigated and learned the male had reported a female possibly driving impaired in Three Hills on January 10, 2026. Police had investigated that matter when it was reported. Further investigation showed the male had provided a false report, including using a false name.

A 39-year-old male from Grande Prairie has been charged with public mischief.

Assault on Police Officer

On January 19, 2026, at 4:06 PM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of a female experiencing a mental health crisis in Delburne. Police attended with EMS, and the responding officer was struck in the face by an object thrown by the female. She was subsequently arrested and later released on an Appearance Notice. The officer suffered minor injuries as a result of the assault.

A 46-year-old female from Delburne has been charged with assault on a police officer with a weapon.

Theft from Motor Vehicle

On January 20, 2026, Three Hills RCMP received reports of several vehicles broken into and items stolen in Elnora and Trochu. Police investigated and determined the suspect(s) stole a wallet; bank cards, identification cards, and other items were stolen from vehicles in both communities. The thefts are believed to have occurred during the night/early morning hours.

Theft of Boat

On January 21, 2026, at approximately 8:10 AM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of a boat abandoned in a ditch in Red Deer County. Police attended the scene and had the boat removed from the ditch and brought to the detachment to try and locate the owner.

Later in the day, at approximately 9:34 PM, Three Hills RCMP received a report of a boat and trailer stolen from a rural property in Red Deer County. Police determined the boat previously found in the ditch was the boat stolen from the property. The boat was returned to the owner; however, the trailer was not recovered.

Public Education and Awareness

Assault-Style Firearms Compensation Program

The Government of Canada has prohibited approximately 2,500 make and models of Assault-Style Firearms. On January 19, 2026, the Government of Canada launched its Assault Style Firearms Compensation Program, commonly known as the "Gun Buy-

Back Program” which provides fair compensation for the destruction or deactivation of prohibited firearms.

The program is led by Public Safety Canada, and the Alberta RCMP have no involvement. Therefore, the RCMP is unable to answer any questions about the program. If someone wishes to surrender their firearm to the RCMP, it will fall outside of the Assault-Style Firearms Compensation Program and they **will not be compensated for their firearm.**
