Station 8 Responds to Multi-Family Structure Fire

Crews from [Red Deer County](#) Station 8 in Delburne responded to a multi-family structure fire early in the evening of March 2, 2026. A quick response by engine 8 members brought the fire under control in an upper-level apartment preventing further damage.

Upon arrival fire crews observed smoke coming from within the building and immediately initiated an interior attack successfully containing the fire before it could spread. Thanks to the quick actions of these first responders, no injuries or fatalities were reported, and property damage was minimized. Fire crews from Station 11 in Elnora and Red Deer County Station 1 responded to the scene to provide additional support and resources. The cause of the fire remains under investigation and officials have not released any further details.

2026 PROPERTY TAXES

Council passed *Bylaw No. 1216/2026, the 2026 Tax Rate Bylaw*, at the April 14th meeting. The General Municipal Levy did not need to be increased because there has been an assessment growth of 1.1%. The General Municipal Levy is the portion of the property tax that the Village retains to fund operations and services.

There are 3 requisitions set by the Government of Alberta which the Village collects and transfers to the Province. These requisitions are:

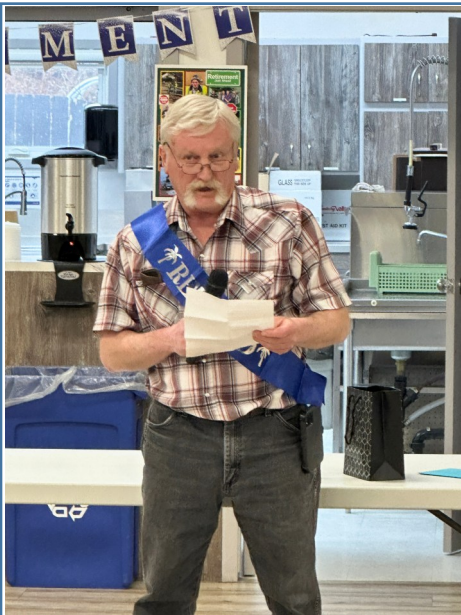
- Alberta School Foundation Fund (ASFF)
- Homes for the Aged/Seniors Foundation
- Police Funding

2026 Government of Alberta requisitions:

- Homes for the Aged/Seniors Foundation has not changed
- Police funding has increased by 7.4%
- The ASFF has increased by 9.9% for residential properties and decreased by 0.38% for non-residential properties.

Overall, the residential tax will be 2.8% higher and the non-residential tax will increase by 0.07%.

Property tax notices will be mailed in mid-May. Payment is due on or before June 30, 2026. A 15% penalty will be applied on July 1, 2026.

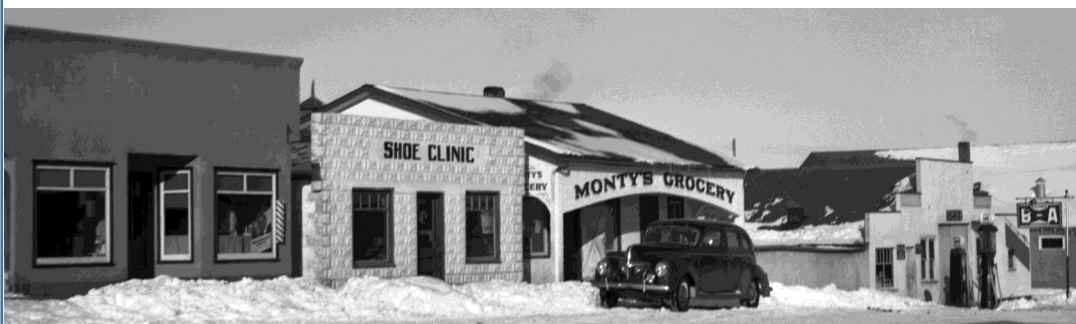

Building Demolished on Main Street

The building across from the Village office was demolished on April 2nd. Last year, an inspection was done to determine its structural integrity because the original plan was to transfer it to the Anthony Henday Museum. The building used to be known as Monty's, a grocery store. Jack Montgomery established the business in 1932 and it was in operation until his death in 1967. The building has been vacant for many years.

Unfortunately, the inspection showed that it was unstable and relocation was unfeasible. The building was taken down for safety reasons. Currently, there are no plans for the site.

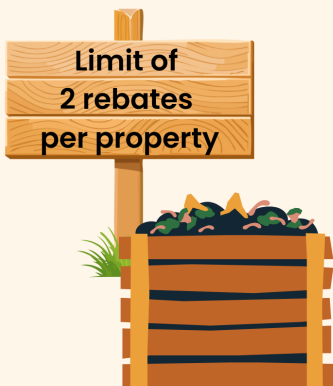

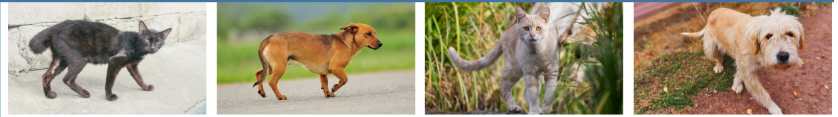
Tim loved Delburne and serving on council for 12 years. We heard more than one person say, "Tim would have loved this" You are right! He would have loved it.

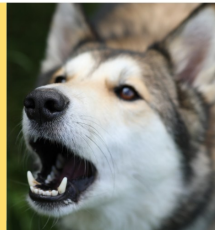

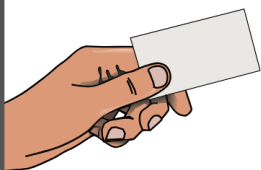

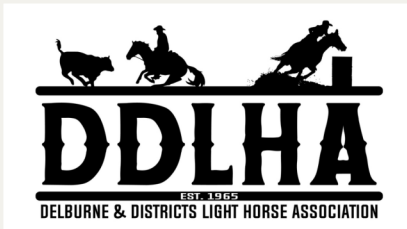

Check out the *FireSmart Begins at Home Guide* for an in-depth look at how you can build wildfire resiliency.

IMMEDIATE ZONE 0m to 1.5m

The Immediate Zone is a non-combustible area that starts at the house and extends to a 1.5 metre perimeter around the home and attached structures, including decks. Reduce the chance of wind-blown embers igniting your home by starting with these proactive steps:

- Choose non-combustible building materials when constructing or renovating your home.
- Clear vegetation and combustible material down to mineral soil and cover with non-combustible materials like gravel, brick, or concrete.
- Avoid planting woody shrubs or trees. If any are present, prune and maintain them regularly.

INTERMEDIATE ZONE 1.5m to 10m

Elements in the Intermediate Zone are managed so they don't transmit fire to your home. Here are a few actions you can take to reduce your home's vulnerability:

- Plant fire-resistant vegetation and select non-combustible landscaping materials.
- Avoid incorporating any woody debris, including mulch.
- Keep combustible items like firewood piles, construction materials, patio furniture, tools, and decorative pieces out of this zone.
- Move trailers, recreational vehicles, storage sheds, and other combustible structures into the Extended Zone. If that is not possible, store firewood inside your mitigated garage, shed, or other ember-resistant structures.
- Create a non-combustible ground cover, like a gravel pad, underneath and 1.5 metres around trailers, recreational vehicles, and sheds.

EXTENDED ZONE 10m to 30m

The goal in the Extended Zone is not to eliminate fire, but to reduce its intensity. If your property extends into this zone, a few important steps you can take include:

- Selectively remove evergreen trees to create at least 3 metres of horizontal space between the single or grouped tree crowns.
- Remove all branches to a height of 2 metres from the ground.
- Regularly clean up accumulations of fallen branches, dry grass, and needles to eliminate potential surface fuels.
- Continue to apply these principles if your property extends beyond 30m. Work with your neighbours in overlapping zones and seek guidance of a forest professional if affected by other conditions, like steep slopes.

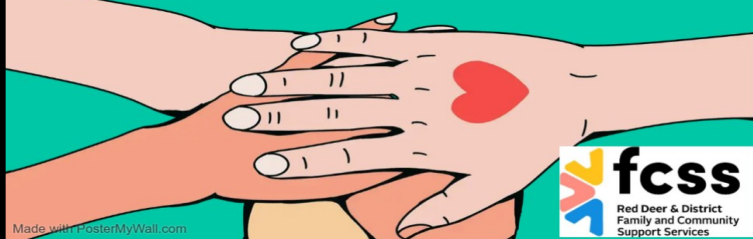
