Village of Delburne Outdoor Water Restrictions

In effect May 1st to October 1st



Even numbered addresses are permitted to water on even days of the month between 6 pm to 10 pm

Odd numbered addresses are permitted to water on odd days of the month between 6 pm to 10 pm

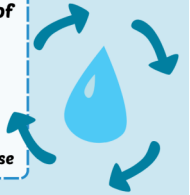
The Water Restrictions Policy No. 1-014 outlines 4 stages of restrictions which are defined by specific metrics or triggers in relation to our water supply.

Stage 1: Water Conservation

Stage 2: Reduce Water Use

Stage 3: Reduce Non-Essential Water Use

Stage 4: Emergency Water Shortage & Stop All Non-Essential Water Use



We are currently in Stage 1: Water Conservation

- Watering lawns, trees, shrubs, & gardens on designated days and times.
- No restrictions for filling of pools, hot tubs, or water features.
- No restrictions for cleaning outdoor surfaces.
- It is recommended that vehicles are washed at a commercial car wash.



Residents who have installed and are watering new sod are asked to contact the Village Office at 403-749-3606 or village@delburne.ca. This helps us track short-term increases in water usage.

New Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw

A new Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw, *Bylaw No. 1213/2026*, was passed on May 26, 2026. Council changed the Bylaw to better deal with aggressive dogs and to let residents have more pets.

If a dog is declared an **Aggressive Dog**, by the Court of King's Bench of Alberta, these rules apply:

- The owner must register the dog as an Aggressive Dog with the Village Office.
- When off the owner's property, the Aggressive Dog must be muzzled and on leash that is held by someone who can control it.
- When outside on the owner's property, the Aggressive Dog must be kept in a locked pen or enclosure that it cannot escape from.
- "Aggressive Dog" signs must be posted at every entrance to the property and on the locked pen or enclosure.

A new **Excess Pet Permit** is now available in response to community requests from residents who wish to have more than three dogs or three cats. This permit also supports local breeders and residents who generously foster animals through rescue organizations. The Excess Pet Permit costs \$75 per additional pet each year.

Pet licenses can be purchased at the Village office. Animal Control Services provides Bylaw Enforcement for the Village. For animal concerns, please contact them at 403-506-9380.

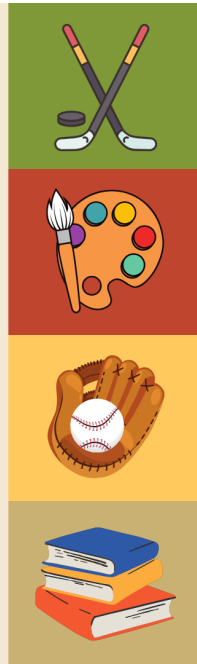



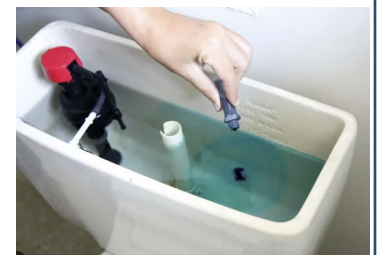

High Water Consumption on Your Utility Bill?

Leaks or changes in use can increase your water consumption more than you think. Outdoor watering, house guests, or a new water-intensive appliance, like a water softener, can increase your monthly consumption. A leaky toilet or faucet that is left unfixed wastes a lot of water. Toilets are a common cause of water leaks because of a broken or stuck flapper. A leaky toilet can use up to 20 cubic metres of water a day.

Sometimes the toilet does not appear to be leaking but hidden leaks happen. If you notice high water consumption on your utility bill then test your toilet for leaks! Place food colouring in the back of the tank. Do not flush. Wait and watch for 10 minutes. If colour seeps into the toilet bowl, then you have a leak.

Conserve water and save money by monitoring your home for leaks.

Off Highway Vehicles Bylaw No. 1089/2011

Operational Restrictions

No person shall operate an off-highway vehicle on any highway except as specifically provided for within this bylaw

- Section 4.1

- Any travel will be from the owners residence using the shortest route out of town
- Use the roadway only and at a maximum speed of 10 km/hr
- Hours of operation of an off-highway vehicle is between 9:00 AM and 9:00 PM
- Operator must wear an approved for "off-highway use" safety helmet

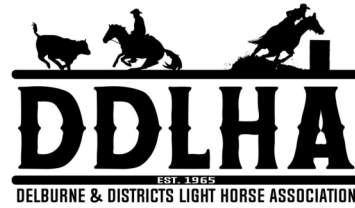
