

Legion Celebrates 100th Anniversary

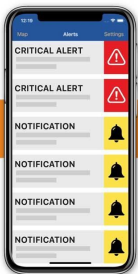
On July 17, 1926, the Royal Canadian Legion was officially incorporated by a special Act of Parliament, a date now recognized as the Legion's anniversary. The Legion's mission is to support veterans, advocate for their rights, and ensure the act of Remembrance continues.

To celebrate 100 years, the Village partnered with the Delburne Ardley Legion to paint three crosswalks at the intersection of Main Street and 22nd Ave. The Legion Commemorative Crosswalk

honours veterans with a maple leaf and a tribute statement in both English and French.

On July 22nd, Member of Parliament for Red Deer Burton Bailey, Delburne Ardley Legion President David Timms, and Mayor Jeff Bourne celebrated with a special sidewalk dedication.

Village of Delburne Outdoor Water Restrictions

In effect May 1st to October 1st



Even numbered addresses are permitted to water on **even days** of the month between 6 pm to 10 pm

Odd numbered addresses are permitted to water on **odd days** of the month between 6 pm to 10 pm

The Water Restrictions Policy outlines 4 stages of restrictions which are defined by specific metrics or triggers in relation to our water supply.

We are currently in Stage 1: Water Conservation:

- Watering lawns, trees, & gardens on designated days and times.
- No restrictions for filling of pools, hot tubs, or water features.
- No restrictions for cleaning outdoor surfaces.

Watering sod or grass seed? Let the Village Office know.

This helps us track short-term increases in water usage.

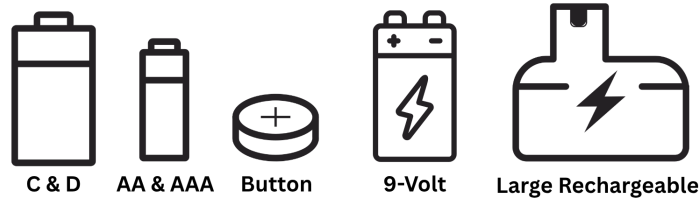

Recycle Your Household Batteries at the Village Office

The Recycling Battery Box has arrived! Residents can safely recycle used household batteries by taking them to the Village office (2111 20th St.) during business hours. **Please do not put batteries through the front door mail slot.**

Rechargeable and single-use dry cell batteries that weigh 5 kg or less will be accepted.



Battery Protection:

Safety guidelines require that terminals of certain battery types must be protected to prevent contact with each other. Unprotected battery terminals can cause sparks and lead to a fire.

Lithium-ion, small-sealed lead acid or lithium primary, and alkaline batteries that are 12V or more, must be protected. There are 2 methods of protection:

1. Place the battery in a clear plastic bag. One battery per bag.
2. If no bags are available, tape the positive (+) terminal with a non-conductive tape such as clear packing tape, electrical tape or duct tape. Make sure the tape does not cover the chemistry label. **DO NOT USE:** Scotch tape, masking tape, or painter's tape.
 - For coin or button cells, make a "battery ravioli" by sealing them between two pieces of tape (sticky sides in).

Typical alkaline batteries can be placed in a single bag with other alkaline batteries, or placed directly in the box. Residents can pick up a Mini Battery Cube at the Village Office to help kick-start their collection.

Protect What Matters. Be Battery Safe!

- **NEVER** throw away batteries in the garbage or blue bin.
- **Store batteries out of direct sunlight and don't leave them in hot vehicles.**
- **Collect batteries in non-metal containers and store safely.**

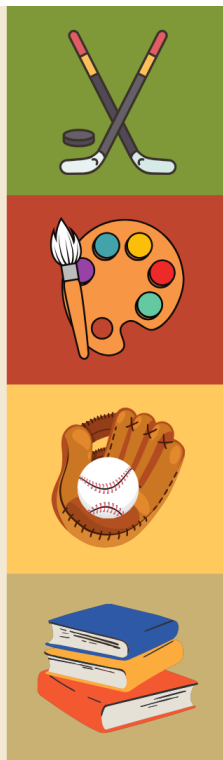

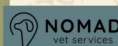
